A **VISION** is what we want to **BECOME**.

TCF's Vision:

A **VALUE** is one's judgment of what is **IMPORTANT** in life.

TCF's 6 Values:

1. **TEACH** God's Word as authority and the **FOUNDATION** upon which we build our lives. (*Psalm 119:28, 54, 89, 105; 138:2; John 1:1,4; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Hebrews 4:12; Philippians 2:9-11; Luke 21:33; James 1:21; Romans 1:16; Matthew 4:4, 7:24-25; Deuteronomy 6:6-7*)

2. **HONOR** God with honest and open hearts of **WORSHIP**. (*Matthew 15:8; Isaiah 1:11-17, 29:13; John 4:21-24, 20:19-28; Deuteronomy 6:5,13; Genesis 22:1-18; Micah 6:6-8; Jeremiah 7:22; Philippians 2:13*)

What might be some signs that we are failing to view His Word in these ways? Signs that we are viewing His Word in these ways?
5. Why do we so often relate worship to (only) singing songs? Warren Wiersbe said, "Worship is what we do with our lives, not our lips." How is worship so much more than a song? In what ways can we worship God?
