3. The overall theme of Leviticus could be summed up in one word: holiness. What is holiness? In what ways do we (the Church as a whole, and perhaps us individually) not give this enough attention / overlook or downplay it?
4. In Leviticus 10, Nadab and Abihu offered 'strange fire' before the Lord, and they were consumed. What lesson can we learn from this? In what ways do we sometimes 'offer strange fire'? What motivates us to do this?
5. What instances of grumbling and complaining did we look at in the book of Numbers? What did this lead to in each of those situations? In what ways do grumbling and complaining affect us today?
6. The Israelites' progress on their journey to the Promised Land was disrupted by disobedience and unbelief (book of Numbers). What threatens our progress in the Lord on a daily/regular basis? How could/should we respond to these threats?
