1.	What we do with our hands begins in our HEAD and HEART . (Philippians 2:13; 2 Corinthians
	10:5; Proverbs 4:23-27; Romans 12:2; Philippians 4:8; Colossians 3:1-2)

- 2. Flattery and **SCHMOOZING** can be super destructive. (Proverbs 26:28, 29:5; Romans 16:18; Psalm 5:9, 12:3, 55:21; 1 Thessalonians 2:5; Jude 1:16; 1 John 4:1)
- 3. Do not think too **HIGHLY** of yourself. (Romans 12:3-5,16; Galatians 6:3; Proverbs 16:18, 26:12; 1 Peter 4:10-11; 2 Corinthians 12:7; Micah 6:8; Luke 18:11)
- 4. Stealing someone's heart...is stealing, which is taking something that **DOES NOT** belong to us. (John 10:10; Proverbs 24:3, 27:6; Philippians 4:7; John 14:27)
- 5. Be careful of appearing **SPIRITUAL** while having ulterior or improper **MOTIVES**. (2 Timothy 3:5; Matthew 7:21-23; 1 John 2:3-5; Mark 7:9; John 13:35; Galatians 5:22; Proverbs 21:2; 1 Thessalonians 2:4; 1 Timothy 1:5; 1 Samuel 16:7)
- 6. <u>UNHEALTHY</u> things grow too. This is why we must recognize them and cut them off. (Revelation 18:4; 1 John 1:9; Colossians 3:5-15; Ephesians 4:22-31; Proverbs 28:13; James 4:7)
