The law reveals our sinfulness before God that we might accept His merciful love and save us from Justice.

No one is sinless.

Sin is personal.

Sin whether intentional or unintentional is still sin.

Sin requires substitutionary sacrifice (propitiation).

Sin requires atonement (expiation) removal of sin/guilt.

Willful unrepentent sin brings the wrath of God.

God cannot suspend His Holiness.

God cannot ignore sin.

God can impart grace but not without satisfying justice.

## The Mosaic Law

Revealed sin so that people were aware of their position and accountability before God resulting in humility and obedience faith in His mediation.

## The Sacrificial System

The sacrificial system provided a substitutional blood sacrifice (propitiation) and purification through atonement (expiation) until the perfect redemptive work of the Messiah was complete in Jesus.



God has provided a way to satisfy justice and allow  
Him to be dwell among His people.

## Pagan Worship

Pagan worship perversely requires sacrifice (animal and human) to appease the false gods (demons) that they worship.

Deuteronomy 32:16-17; Leviticus 17:7

Idol worship are vain acts of propitiation intended to gain what we want rather than what we need.

We don't worship false idols and demons anymore!

People kill babies for convenience and career and fight for the right to do so.

It's not their body unless they created themselves nor their right.

Procreation requires a man and woman.

Abortion for the sake of convenience and career is a form of eugenics/euthanasia which are acts of demonic worship.

Sir Dalton Galton,  
Margaret Sanger (Planned Parenthood),  
Nazi Regime,  
and the list continues throughout modern history.

Men becoming mere sperm donors and abandoning their God given familial responsibilities to protect and provide for the sake of lust and fornication.

Women allowing themselves to be used as human incubators ignoring the sanctity of their God given responsibilities to nurture and care, for the sake of love and fornication.

Thank you Jesus that there is forgiveness for such sins or I could not stand here today preaching the truth of God.



To get the most out of sin or to deal with the consequences, people abuse drugs and alcohol to quiet the guilt or conviction of the truth.

Then we worship God our way as we worship the false idols and their demons pleading for mercy so we can go to heaven without acknowledgement or turning from sin.

## Isaiah 1:11–13 (ESV)

11 “What to me is the multitude of your sacrifices? says the LORD; I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams and the fat of well-fed beasts; I do not delight in the blood of bulls, or of lambs, or of goats.

12 “When you come to appear before me, who has required of you this trampling of my courts?

13 Bring no more vain offerings; incense is an abomination to me. New moon and Sabbath and the calling of convocations— I cannot endure iniquity and solemn assembly.

## Romans 3:19–20 (ESV)

19 Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God.

20 For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

## Romans 3:21–22 (ESV)

21 But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—

22 the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction:

## Romans 3:23–25 (ESV)

23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,  
24 and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,  
25 whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins.

## Romans 3:26–28 (ESV)

26 It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

27 Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith.

28 For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

## Romans 3:29–31 (ESV)

29 Or is God the God of Jews only? Is he not the God of Gentiles also? Yes, of Gentiles also,

30 since God is one—who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith.

31 Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law.



1 John 2:4–6 (ESV)

4 Whoever says “I know him” but does not keep his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him,  
5 but whoever keeps his word, in him truly the love of God is perfected. By this we may know that we are in him:

6 whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked.

1 John 4:7–9 (ESV)

7 Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God.

8 Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.

9 In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him.

1 John 4:9–10 (ESV)

9 In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him.

10 In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

## The Consecration of the Priests

Aaron, of the tribe of Levi, and his 4 sons were chosen to serve the Lord as priests.

## Hebrews 2:17 (ESV)

17 Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people.

1 John 2:1–3 (ESV)

1 My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.

2 He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

3 And by this we know that we have come to know him, if we keep his commandments.

Jesus became the:

Propitiatory Perfect Sacrifice satisfying God's judicial wrath.

Expiatory Atonement cleansing us from sin.

## Galatians 3:21–22 (ESV)

21 Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law.

22 But the Scripture imprisoned everything under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.



## Galatians 3:23–24 (ESV)

23 Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed.

24 So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith.

## Galatians 3:25–27 (ESV)

25 But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian,

26 for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith.

27 For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.

## Galatians 3:28–29 (ESV)

28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.
