Don't Drift Away

Hebrews 2:1-4

This week, Matt examines the first of several warnings that we will find in the book of Hebrews. He gives several examples of how these warnings may seem harsh at first sight but are ultimately for our own good. This warning in Chapter two encourages us to listen carefully to God's truth and to remind ourselves of it daily or else we may drift from it and put our soul in jeopardy. In order for us to accept the good news of the gospel, we first have to accept the reality of our own sin.

- 1 Give an example of a warning or punishment from your past that you felt was unfair the moment but now realize was beneficial for you.
- 2 Matt described angels as mighty warriors who are capable of wiping out an entire army in one night. How is this different than our culture's typical view of angels?
- 3 Chapters 1 and 2 state clearly that Jesus are greater than the angels. How does the different view of angels (question 2) change your view of Jesus' power?
- 4 In what ways am I guilty of trusting in my own strength, power, money, status, etc. and not in God?
- 5 When am I most likely to drift from God's word and presence? What steps can I take to keep that from happening?
