Title: Zero to Hero **Text:** Judges 10-12

Target: God takes people nobody wants and makes them people everybody wants.

- I. Reputation of <u>Rejection</u>: "Now Jephthah the Gileadite was a mighty warrior, but he was the son of a prostitute. Gilead was the father of Jephthah." (Vs.11:1)
- II.
- A. His Reproach: "BUT he was the son of a prostitute"
- **B.** His Removal: "they drove Jephthah out" (Vs. 2)
- **C. His Rebuke:** "you shall not have an **inheritance** in our father's house" (Vs. 2b)
- **D.** His Refuge: "Then Jephthah fled from his brothers and lived in the land of Tob, and worthless fellows collected around Jephthah" (Vs. 3)
- **III. Plea for** <u>Protection: "And they (elders) said to Jephthah, "Come and be our leader, that we may fight against the Ammonites." (Vs.11:6)</u>
 - **A. His Praise:** "be **OUR** leader" (Vs. 6)
 - **B.** His Pain: "Did you not hate me and drive me out of my father's house? (Vs. 7)
 - C. His Purpose: "go with us and fight against the Ammonites and be our head over all the inhabitants of Gilead." (Vs. 8) *The head, not the tail. (Duet. 28:12-13)
 - **D.** His Priority: "If... the LORD gives them over to me, I will be your head." (Vs. 9) "And Jephthah spoke all his words before the LORD at Mizpah." (Vs. 11)
- **IV. Decision for** <u>Deliberation</u>: "Then Jephthah sent messengers to the king... "What do you have against me, that you have come to me to fight against my land?" (Vs.11:12)
 - **A.** His Discernment: "Jephthah again sent messengers to the king of the Ammonites" (Vs.14)
 - **B.** His Diplomacy: "Will you not possess what Chemosh your god gives you to possess? And all that the Lord our God has dispossessed before us, we will possess." (Vs. 24)
 - C. His Distinction: "I therefore have not sinned against you, and you do me wrong by making war on me. The LORD, the Judge, decide this day between the people of Israel and the people of Ammon." (Vs. 27)
- V. View of <u>Vindication</u>: "Then the Spirit of the LORD was upon Jephthah, and he **passed** through Gilead and Manasseh and **passed** on to Mizpah of Gilead, and from Mizpah of Gilead he **passed** on to the Ammonites" (Vs.11:29) *This was a salute to a warrior!
 - A. His Vitality: "Spirit of the Lord"
 - **B.** His Vow: "then whatever comes out from the doors of my house to meet me when I return in peace from the Ammonites shall be the LORD's, and I will offer it up for a burnt offering." (Vs.31)
 - **C.** His Victory: "So Jephthah crossed over to the Ammonites to fight against them, and the LORD gave them into his hand." (Vs. 32)
 - **D. His Vice:** "Then Jephthah came to his home at Mizpah. And behold, his daughter came out to meet him with tambourines and with dances. **She was his only child**; besides her he had neither son nor daughter." (Vs. 34)

E. His Virtue: "Jephthah judged Israel six years. Then Jephthah the Gileadite died and was buried in his city in Gilead." (Vs. 12:7)

Takeaway: You may feel abandoned, not forsaken, crushed, but not defeated, cast down, but not destroyed! (1 Cor. 4:8-9)
