So Harriet had been praying in faith for God's healing touch; and speaking to her friend who leads worship at her old church in Virginia this was confirmed when she said "Harriet, God is going to heal you." The surgery was endoscopic and was simpler and shorter than the surgeon anticipated. Harriet was prescribed pain medication, but thus far she is feeling no pain and gives thanks to God for that.

Redmond is becoming increasingly diverse, with many neighbors coming from India. Join us Saturday and Sunday, September 9 & 10, for a weekend focused on Global Missions, led by a Guest Missionary, Ken (pseudonym). He has walked alongside high-caste Hindus for 15 years in both India and America. He serves with Pioneers International, which focuses on church planting movements among unreached people groups.

Currently Ken's family leads a team who serves among the Hindu diaspora in Dallas/Fort Worth, walking alongside them on their spiritual journeys. He leads an online community that guides and coaches international students and professionals to be more successful in America. Ken loves to help train and equip others in cross-cultural communication, Indian culture, and Hinduism.
