The Supremacy of Christ in Christian Roles Rev. Jason Dorsey

The great Christian virtue Agape/Love "And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony" (3:14) is fulfilled by doing your duty in your God-appointed roles

DUTY

Are you kidding me?

I'm not in the military I'm Free

Argue that doing your duty is how you love!

Please consider...

1) The inescapable link between love + duty [III] Biblical Link

- It Text 3:12-4:1 the command to love is connected to the "household rules" in Christian ethic
- Descripture De Commands to love our neighbor as ourself is carried out in specific commands Second Table of Law

OK but that is the Bible, and I don't believe the Bible. Why do you say that love is inescapably linked to doing one's duty?

- 1. We intuitively know that "duty" is tied to love
 - Husband who says "I love you" to his wife but who regularly cheats on her.
 - If Wife who says "I love you" to her husband but disrespects him + holds him in contempt
 - If Father Who says "I love you" to his som but has no boundaries + constantly provokes
 - Employee who says "I love this company" but who steals, is lazy + rebellious
 - Employer who isays "I love my workers" but is unjust + unfair in his treatment of them

You intuitively know that each person referred to above has duties tied to their roles > 3:18-4:1

2. Love is needed as a kind of Gardener of our roles, loves, responsibilities (.S. Lewis

The loving duty of your roles

EE Quick Primer on Roles

1. Roles are O-appointed

LORD & KING JESUS - is Sovereign Master in Heaven, WCF on Providence LORD & appoints all things - including ourples - for his glory + our good.

Bondservants Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the LORD. Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the LORD and not for men, knowing that you will receive the inheritance as your reward.
