Sermon

The Dance of Marriage

Rev. Jason Dorsey

Within the safe haven of covenant marriage (Sermon #2) and aware of your/your spouse's brokenness (Sermon #1) you can dare to do the dance of marriage in preparation for your Dance w. A ! A is JEALOUS

Dance of marriage = "wives submit to your own husbands ... husbands love your wives"

Don't get stuck in offendedness and contempt and ridicule at this command and miss the big picture Mega-Mystery
"this mystery is profound" 5:32 of Gospel

January - March of 1992 I spent in Moscow w. Peter + Anita Deyneka, missionary leaders, many adventures, taught English + started clubs in schools to talk about xity. Dance class as P.E. Waltz. Jeanning the steps of the dance. Mind was on marrying Jenny.

EE The Dance of Marriage

1) The Wife's step in the dance

"Wives submit to your own husbands, as to the ford. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands."

Wife's step = submit to her husband as to the ford

NOT

- Women's submission to men in general, but in role of wife to your own husband
- I Not about equality (both man and woman are equal before God in status as persons) or about competency My trying to Waltz
- I Not based on husbands worthiness, not "worthy" husbands but just husbands
- IN Not submission in wrongdoing for "the church submits to Christ
- IS Analogy, husband as the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church
 - I Submission is in your role as wife, like when an employee goes to work
 - I Submission is as to the ford, i.e. Comprehensive "in everything," trusting, and joy ful
 - I Submission respects the O-ordained leadership role of the husband and draws it forth. " let the wife see that she respects her husband 5:33

Like the young woman teaching me to Waltz called forth, drew forth, my role as the lead in the Waltz

Jes, Super hard ... But don't reject and disown this command by 1,000 qualifications It is preparing you for the Divine Pance W. O, so learn your steps and Wait 1

3) The Husband's step in the dance

"Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but noonishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body." 5:25-30

If Mega-Mystery = O's Secret, an "extra-ordinarily great, wonderful and profound truth that can be understood only with the help of O's Spirit."

Talk to your Marriage as Practice

- 1. Sceptic/Seeker = Your marriage doesn't make you happy because it can't; it was never intended to. It is made to point you to O, the Divine Romance, an intimacy with your Creator/Redeemer beyond your wildest dreams.
- 2. Christian = Beware of Jealousy. O is the Chief End + Greatest Good of your Spouse. Bring your spouse to Jesus [Married] Wait for Jesus if single

We heard updates this week from our partners at RUF UW (Ali Gosselin) and RUF WWU (Nathaniel Thompson). Covid-19 has greatly impacted their ability to meet students in person, but they have been busy connecting with each other through Zoom. We are encouraged by their faithfulness and steadfast hope in trial, and we pray that the Lord continues to encourage them in the coming months. Ali has asked us for support for the upcoming year for her ministry needs. Please prayerfully consider her request. I have responded to her that the Church and Deacons will be reviewing our budgets and giving requests and will look for ways to support if we can. Nathaniel reports a large gap in their budget due to a lack of onetime gifts that make up 30% of their usual support, so they will be launching a close-the-gap campaign this summer. True Justice

We recommend a powerful documentary on Justice: <u>True Justice: Bryan Stevenson's Fight For Equality</u>. Bryan Stevenson is an American lawyer, social justice

activist, founder/executive director of the Equal Justice Initiative, and a clinical professor at New York University School of Law. who has dedicated his life to fighting for justice and equality for the poor, disabled and disadvantaged including children convicted and sentenced to die. Bryan has helped 156 people be cleared and removed from death row over the last 30 years. Bryan's faith molded his life and decision to pursue this calling.

This is a powerful documentary on systemic inequality spurred from years of legal decisions that shape the landscape we find ourselves in.
