Scripture Reading Genesis 9:1-18

9 And God blessed Noah and his sons and said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth.² The fear of you and the dread of you shall be upon every beast of the earth and upon every bird of the heavens, upon everything that creeps on the ground and all the fish of the sea. Into your hand they are delivered.³ Every moving thing that lives shall be food for you. And as I gave you the green plants, I give you everything.⁴ But you shall not eat flesh with its life, that is, its blood.⁵ And for your lifeblood I will require a reckoning: from every beast I will require it and from man. From his fellow man I will require a reckoning for the life of man.

⁶ "Whoever sheds the blood of man, by man shall his blood be shed, for God made man in his own image.

⁷ And you, be fruitful and multiply, increase greatly on the earth and multiply in it."

⁸ Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, ⁹ "Behold, I establish my covenant with you and your offspring after you, ¹⁰ and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the livestock, and every beast of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark; it is for every beast of the earth. ¹¹ I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of the flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." ¹² And God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: ¹³ I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. ¹⁴ When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, ¹⁵ I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh. And the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. ¹⁶ When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and

every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." ¹⁷ God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

¹⁸ The sons of Noah who went forth from the ark were Shem, Ham, and Japheth. (Ham was the father of Canaan.)

Romans 13:1-7

1 3 Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. ² Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment.³ For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, ⁴ for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. ⁵ Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience. ⁶ For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. ⁷ Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed.

Thank you again so much for your prayers and support!! I keep watching God be faithful and one of the ways I've seen his faithfulness is through your prayers and support! Last week was the soccer camp, which was fantastic. Two teams from Virginia and Georgia came to run the camp - about 60 kids came and it was awesome!! I helped with a group of 5-6 year old boys. What a gift it was to see God's image in these campers and walk with them last week. I got to work with one little boy who ended up having a blast at camp. The other interns and I might get to see him later this summer too since his mom goes to Scott and Ruth's church! This week, Scott and Ruth went to General Assembly in St. Louis, so I am getting to visit with Cyndy Crowner!!! In my next week email I'll send out a description of our time together-I'm so grateful for her and this week!!

Update from the Stoms in South Africa

Hope you are well. I'm sorry for not communicating recently. My email was hacked and it has wreaked havoc with my emails.

We've been continuing our 'Story Group' via a Zoom conference call and have been doing so for over a year now. We were transitioning out of Covid protection mode, but we kept doing a Zoom call because we have a Kenyan who is teaching at a University in the Eastern Cape (SA) and a Korean minister who's now back in Korea who also join us. We've been meeting for the last two months with another group in person at a Café in one of the University buildings. It has been great to interact in person, which is much better when you're doing Biblical Storytelling. We're not a big group, but our students are coming from Nigeria, Ethiopia, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Korea, the Philippines and from South Africa. The South Africans are of differing ethnicities (black, white, and coloured). (their terminology). We've been storying through Luke's gospel and are nearing the end. When you're telling

Biblical stories and facilitating group discussion the multi-ethnic aspect can be fascinating.

Unfortunately, we're now having a Covid surge here in SA; after the hope that Covid was a diminishing issue. This is SA's third wave and we're moving into winter. We've had various stages of lockdowns over the past year, and now things are getting more restrictive again and our area is a hotspot. Unfortunately, the University of Stellenbosch just re-closed their common areas such as libraries and cafes which is a setback for our in-person meetings.

Thanks for your prayers. Clara's study visa has come in and I hope to pick it up next week (Praise God!). We are still waiting for visas for Laura, Katherine, and Lauren to be processed. After that we'll seek to extend so we can stay beyond April 2022. Clara is enjoying the Rhenish Girl's High School and is doing very well. Lauren has been accepted there for 8th grade for 2022 and she seems to be excited. Please pray for South Africa, for the International Student ministry, the 'Story Group' and for our daughter's education and for our family. Pray also for God's continued provision as the dollar seems to be decreasing in value and expenses are increasing. Thanks for praying for us. Your partnership with us in the gospel in South Africa is deeply appreciated.
