
Where the story gets dramatic, daring ... identity healing

 - 1. JESUS IS THE HEALING &

E Promised in Is 61, the healing King 5:38-44 "hands of the true King are the hands of a healer," Holy O before who Petersees sinfulness, who togches the leper + heals him + sends him to the priest, who forgives the sin of the paralytic + heals his body, Who is the Bridegroom and Old Wine fulfilling Os ancient purposes ! And who is enlarging the boundaries of Table Fellowship w. O



- Pill? Every person is called to follow Him, to make Jesus their deep, primary identity, to own their sickness + repeat + receive His healing. The only thing that will exclude you from his embrace is not owning your sickness + receiving His healing.
- 2. Xtian = healed identity Volf, Galatians Z:20 Luke models the identity of hospitality, inviting people into friendship, community, relationship W. O Redeemer in ZO17

Why Xtians so inhospitable? Exclusionary vs. Embrace? Great Q = Forgotten their sickness + healing ! You?

COMMUNITY GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. How does the Pharisees response to Jesus' Table Fellowship with Levi and his friends reveal the problem of the human condition being that of building identities that exclude others?
- 2. How does (1) Jesus' call to Levi and (2) rebuke of the Pharisees show that the solution is not just affirming all identities or exalting religious identities but accepting that we are sinners who need the healing grace of Jesus and who must center our entire lives on Jesus.
- 3. Self-Assessment: Has Jesus Christ become your identity (i.e. you are a sinner who needs healing, Christ as your Great Physician)? Has this led you to an identity of embrace like Jesus who ate with Tax Collectors and challenged Pharisees?

(2) Presents us w. our contemporary sickness

Sickness ? Isn't it sin ? Yes but dig deeper, sin as = Exclusionary Identies

The moment the identities that we affirm and cherish (sexual, cultural, racial, family, tribe, ideology, religions...) become our deep, primary identity they take on an exclusionary force, create a moral high ground

Religious identities Pharisees → Today
 That's why I'm anti-religion, problem of intokrance

Er Secular/Irreligious identities Ideological "high ground" of cherished Pluralism "Moral Grumbling"... shame, social outcasts today

Profound problem w. Cherishing deep identity pluralism=

- 1. W/o a common, shared, deep/primary identity all of our identities will inevitably exclude, be in chaos + create social methodown
- 2. It misses Jesus = Who had a deep, primary identity in Yahweh, [1] Torah, Temple, Priests... but who showed the most radical of hospitality
 - Point? There might be an identity that creates embrace vs. exclusion ?
- Sickness of your #... Pharisees so close but so far away! Open mind to possibility of sickness Your moral grumbling/high ground/guest book
