

1. Something you should know = there is struggle, suffering + loss in the IN Between *Talk w. AP*

☰☰ loss of all things (8), share in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death (10), Not that I have already attained this or am already perfect (12)

Knowing this you can embrace the struggle, the loss and the suffering as Solidarity with Jesus **+** and sanctification in Jesus vs. 10

Examples

2. Something you should do = **Press On**

☑ This is not passivity, but action, energy, effort, intent, purpose...
