Why does this matter? Your ethic/lifestyle/moral life is formed by your community Henri Bergson > Church of & (afternative community) in Corinth

The community you choose forms the person you become!

1) The Nature of Church Discipline

E = Context, Cf. | Corinthians 5:1-13 ... 2 Cor. 2:17

1. It is under the Authority of the WORD of 8 2:17 Formal/Informal

Paul's Apostolic authority > Author of Scripture by Inspiration of Holy Spirit 1 + 2 Corinthians, etc. 2Tim. 3:16

I Scripture sets forth the moral beauty, standard, of O's Holiness

I Under but not beyond Scripture

\*\* Xtian = person under authority of Os Word

- 2. Led by Ministers of Gospel/elders, reinforced by the congregation
- 3. Aims at full forgiveness and restoration "forgive and comfort him" 2:7-10

Shame, exclusion, contempt w/o forgivess

2) The Hardness of Church Discipline

Hard for the Leaders Paul's anguish 2:1-4 "Nothing to offer but blood, toil, sweat + tears"

If Hard for the Person being disciplined vs 6-8

If Hard for the Congregation: When The pain the sin causes 2:5, the challenge of "towing the line" and the hardness of forgiveness + restoration
