How might the Biblical understanding of idolatry help you not only understand the wrath of God but recognize our world's/your need for it: (1) Idols are created things we make ultimate things to save us, that we worship and serve, i.e. get us the comfort, power, approval, security, control our hearts long for, (2) Our worship and service of idols suppresses the truth about God, tells others lies about God, and eventually wounds people made in God's image, (3) God has right, authority and power to call our idolatry that leads to our wounding of people to account and judgment.

Argument #1 The social necessity of the weath of O

- ET3 Key values in our culture are equality, fairness and justice, right?
- If Os wrath is His Personal, settled disposition to bring about perfect justice for all people (equality) W. utter fairness (i.e. punishment = crime). Becky Pippert
- If W/o ultimate justice we undermine (1) social restraint on evil Dostoyevsky, (2) the "proximate" justice system, (3) our moral outrage, and (4) the practice of NON-violence Miroslav Volf

Argument #2 The seriousness of idolatry

Didolatry + wrath tied together here + Rom 1:18-25

Esuppression of truth re O, worshipping created things > service > slavery Addiction

W step further > idols come at a cost, want blood Wounds/attacks those in Os image, who He loves!
