Sign #1 Anxiety+ Worry about \$, possessions

Example = "I don't love \$. I worry about it."

Sign # 2 Security in \$, possessions

Example = "having money in the bank as my security. In a sense that is a lack of faith."

Jesus for 3 years of ministry homeless, no fixed income yet most secure person ever in os love. He taught "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth + rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal." 6:19

Sign#3 Emotional Roller Coaster of \$

Example = Financial Planning > You need this much to refire > Stock Market ron Emotions

Jesus trusted Os provision + taught "Look at the birds of the air; the neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly father feeds them. Are you not of of more value than they?" fre you not of more value?

Sign #4 \$ as Validation

Example = Not a desire to have a lot of money or make a lot of \$. What \$ shows is level of success. Bought old jet ski for \$700° fix it up + sell it for 2K, validates purchase, good job > success

Jesus: If # validates success, what does this say about Jesus who died pennyless



Does # validate you or Jesus?

Sign # 5 # as Status Symbol

Example = Différent income level = différent social strata, In our heart we see ourselves as separated by what we have. See this in 4?

Jesus: You are saved by a poor, pennyless, homeless man & How should this change your \$?

# Sign#6 \$ as Scorekeeping

Example = "I love fairness + justice. Remember that I fair has nothing to do w. it. If \$ is keeping score, I start with 99 points, the other person with 1. I have friends, two zeros less income than me, not less content, and friends two zeros more income than me, not more happy." Don't use \$ Jesus: born into poverty, died in poverty. To KEEP SCORE!

Sign # 7 Over attachment or Under attachment to your possessions

Example of Over Attachment = Every item you keep is loaded w. sentimental value or potential need of that nut or screw. Hoarding + Cleaning, lettinggo

Example of Under Attachment = You want something, desire it, buy it, then lose interest in it, discard. One man father said, not buy you a bike but fix up a bike together and treasure it.

Jesus = leave all, take up cross + follow me Ellul, in Bible, Love is totalitarian, all of you.

Sign #8 The more you have, the more you want, the more you work > rat race

Example = My , Take on more + more, trying to keep up + frustrated vs. joy

Jesus = Had nothing, so he had time, energy, focus to care for people, most important

Sign #9 You possess vs. Steward your stuff

Example = you view your stuff, money, land as yours vs. a gift from O that you should steward for his glory and others good.

Jesus: had no \$ but he stewarded his life for your good + world's salvation

Sign #10

Not known as a breathtakingly GENEROUS PERSON

Example: John Wesley, Methodist Movement Leader, "Make all you can, save all you can, give all you can."
Died w. a few coins + spoons.

JESUS: For you know the grace of our LORD Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich." Il Corinthians 8:9

Don't you see. He died b/c of your + my idolatry to \$\beta\$, to set us free from Tyranny of Money, rest + contentment as sons + daughters of Heavenly Father.

Heidelberg Catechism, Question and Answer #1

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.


## Welcome New Members

Redeemer is thrilled to welcome three families as members of our church family!




