Scripture Reading

John 4:13-42

¹³ Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." ¹⁵ The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water."

¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here." ¹⁷ The woman answered him, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband'; ¹⁸ for you have had five husbands, and the one you now have is not your husband. What you have said is true." ¹⁹ The woman said to him, "Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you say that in Jerusalem is the place where people ought to worship."²¹ Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. ²² You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³ But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. ²⁴ God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." ²⁵ The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." ²⁶ Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he."

²⁷ Just then his disciples came back. They marveled that he was talking with a woman, but no one said, "What do you seek?" or, "Why are you talking with her?" ²⁸ So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, ²⁹ "Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" ³⁰ They went out of the town and were coming to him.

³¹ Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." ³² But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." ³³ So the disciples said to one another, "Has anyone brought him something to eat?" ³⁴ Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. ³⁵ Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. ³⁶ Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. ³⁷ For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' ³⁸ I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor."

³⁹ Many Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me all that I ever did." ⁴⁰ So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them, and he stayed there two days. ⁴¹ And many more believed because of his word. ⁴² They said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world."

This is the Word of the Lord.

The Samaritan Woman Encounters Jesus (Part 2) Rev. Jason Dorsey

1) THREE THEOLOGICAL ASSUMPTIONS > Why?

- 1. Everyone Worships something
 - E Discussion about 5 husbands ► seamlessly to a discussion about worship Piper
 Definition = You worship what is at the center of your life that gives you identity, meaning... What is most weighty to you?
 - What do you serve? Romans 1:18-27

Worship is not optional > Every person worships some person, place, thing? What is the problem? >> If it is not the True God but a false god, it leaves you thirsty? Samaritan Woman

2. Jesus is the center of a New era of worship I<u>Of place</u>: From Temple in Jerusalem to Jesus the tabernacle (1:14), temple (2:19) + Lamb of O (1:29) to everyplace

IT IN time: The hour is coming (21,23) and is NOW here (vs. 23) > W. coming of Jesus

IN Nature: When the true worshippers Will wochip the Father in spirit + truth, i.e. by the Spirit Who draws (3:5ff), fills (7:37ff) + indwells (JN 14-16)

Christian? = A person who has moved from some person, place, or thing as god, to worshipping Jesus, centering their life on him Samaritans 4:395

3. Os will is to make worshippers

I have food to eat that you do Not know [Erik]

Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes + see that the fields are ripe for harvest

This is The Thing that is happening in the world, in you + around you ? Do you see it ? My dads drawing by the Spirit

If you agree w. these theological assumptions you need to apply them ! orthodoxy > orthopraxy

(2) THREE PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS - How?

- 1. Overflow raddresses squaamishness/resentment If you are a living fountain, how can you Not overflow to others + invite "drink"
 - This is not "bait + switch" this is me loving you, overflowing w. love, joy + life

Examples

2. See > addresses discouragement

If O's Spirit has a great harvest for eternal life will you not take heart + be hopeful?

Lift up your eyes, + see the fields are white for harvest My dads drawing, other stories

3. Join > addresses disengagement

If you were helped by others "one sows + another reaps" will you not be a help to plant a seed, hoe a row, work in harrest?
