ET KNew Leviticus + Hebrews have much in common

Hebrews written to Jewish Christians (theory: priests converted to Christ) Who were tempted to drift back to Judaism to show the supremacy of Christ

Breakthrough = "We have an altar... sanctify the people by his blood... Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name
Hebrews is a training manual for New

Covenant Priests, Christians ! Wow, RIFF!

My Job as a Pastor is to train, equip, empower and send PRIESTS of CHRIST ! LEVITICUS > Priests set apart for the Holy Things of O, Holy Place, Ate of the sacrifices of the altar, wore holy vestments, offered sacrifices, mediated between Holy O and unclean > cleans people of O. And IX each year, Day of Atonement, The High Priest Went W. blood insto the Holy of Holies

Consider Hebrew's Message = Through Christ

The Sons of O, The Great High Priest, The Perfect, Final Sacrifice <u>All</u> who trust in Him By Faith have access into the Holy of Holies (Hebrews 10) and ... "You yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." IPeter 2:5, Cf. Exadus 19:6; Revelation 5:10, 20:6; 1Pt. 2:9 See the Breathtaking INCLUSIVITY of this Identity that transcends gender, race, age, "unclean" !

What is the Doctrine, Message, at the Heart of this Inclusive New Identity, PRIESTS OF CHRIST ?

4 Applications of the Supremacy of Christ for the Priests of Christ

FEED ON THE GRACE OF CHRIST Do not be led away lit. "carried off," which evokes images of wind and water] by diverse and strange teachings, for it is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace, not by foods Jewish food regulations, ritual diving, peace offering, Passover; today > Kosher food, Lent diets, etc. which have not benefited those devoted to them. There was a great temptation, tendency,

- for these Jewish Christians to drift back to their ancient traditions, ceremonial worship, venerable past, dietary restrictions, religious identity + devote themselves to them vs. Feeding on the GRACE of Jesus.
- Today !
 - Great Temptation + Tendency still today to devote ourselves to diverse and strange teachings" that can but good + important like # BLM, Biblical Justice is essential to Christian faith but

that severed from the Grace of Jesus do not strengthen the heart + do not benefit those devoted to them. Example of #BLM severed from the Grace of Christ. I Badge of Rightness, ideological superiority Pride I Use black folks, #BLM, to establish + assert moral superiority as an "ally," you're not serving but using Pride

Pride is most evil + ugly sin, feeds racism
 feeding on the GRACE of Christ
 I'm not saved by my Rightness. I was rightfully under judgment + wrath for pride, etc.
 I'I Jesus is Righteous One who became my sin, mercy
 Now I do biblical justice as One who Received Mercy, from a posture of humility



MAKE MUCH OF THE CROSS OF CHRIST

"We have an altar * from which those at the tent have no right to eat." 13:10

*attar="is used in a symbolic fashion typical of the early church to refer to the sacrifice of Christ in all of the complexity with which that is understood in Hebrews."

➤ Wow! Priests of the tabernacle/Temple have no right to eat of Yom Kippur, Day of Atonement "For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the holy places by the high priest are burned outside the camp (Cf. Leviticus 16) > But Jesus altar - Cross and Communion, are open to all Christians

- who are sanctified by His blood, For He is the Ultimate "Day of Atonement" Sacrifice
- "So Jesus suffered outside the gate
 - [John: Trash heap, dump, unclean place] in order to sanctify the people through His own blood. " > Unclean made Clean!



Tor the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the holy places by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sarctify the people through his own blood. Therefore let us go to him outside the camp and bear the reproach [as unclean] he endured. For here we have No lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come." Hebrews 13:11-14

> El Leviticus: touching a dead body, cating unclean food, leprosy, boils, bodily discharges, etc. made one unclean. El Day of Atonement, body of sacrificial animals burned outside the camp, unclean place Leviticus 16:27-28

It Jesus touched the unclean, died in an unclean place Golgotha, town dump, for unclean people, He was not contaminated by this

El His Blood Sanctifies, Makes us Clean

★ As Priests of Christ we must follow him. iN going outside the Camp to the Uncken Crispus Attucks High School, Built on the Town Dump, Blacks segregated "unclean" Who are the unclean in your world? Who are the unclean in your world? Morally Uncleans Morally Uncleans Macially Uncleans Macially Uncleans Morally Uncleans Mitdeologically Uncle who had been permanently banished to the island of Molokai. Here they exed out a miserable existence in disease, fifth + poverty, w/o either family or church to sustain them. Father Damiers volunteered to go live among them. He built churches + chapels, cleaned their water supply, improved homes + haspital, constructed an orphanage, trained choir, served as their teacher, carpenter, priest + friend until one Sunday morning in 1885 during worship he began his sermons "We Lepers." Died on Molokai in 1889 How? Jesus came to You when Uncleans + became Your uncleanness to Sanctify You. You are (kean! Your City!

OFFER SACRIFICES THRU CHRIST

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.
