Westminster Shorter Catechism

Questians and Answers 29-36

Q. 29: How do we take partale in the redemption purchased by Christ.

A: The Spirit applies to us the redemption purchased by Christ by working faith in us, and thereby uniting us to Christ in our effectual calling.

Q. 30: What is effectual calling

A: Effectual calling is the work of God's Spirit, by which, convincing us of our sin and misery, enlightening our minds in the knowledge of Christ, and renewing our wills, he persuades and enables us to embrace Jesus Christ, freely offered to us in the Gospel.

- Q. 31: What benefits are there in this life to those who are effectually called?
- A: Those who are effectually called partake in justification, adoption, sanctification, and the other benefits that, in this life, do either accompany them or flow from them.
- Q. 32: What is justification?
- A: Justification is an act of God's free grace, in which He pardons all our sins, and accepts us as righteous in His sight, only for the righteousness of Christ imputed to us, and received by faith alone.
- Q. 34: What is adoption?
- A. Adoption is an act of God's free grace, by which we are received as Sons of God, and have a right to all the privileges of that standing.
- Q. 35: What is sanctification?
- A: Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, by which we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die to sin and live to righteousness.
- Q. 36: What are the benefits that in this life accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification?
- A: The benefits that in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption and sanctification are: assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, increase of grace, and perseverance to the end.
