Scripture Reading

Jesus is the head of the Church, his bride. His Word is the authority for our life. We let his Word cross our will and we submit to it even when it hurts because we trust that he is good and loves us.

Ephesians 5:32-6:18

³² This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. ³³ However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

6 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² “Honor your father and mother” (this is the first commandment with a promise), ³ “that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land.” ⁴ Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

⁵ Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, ⁶ not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, ⁷ rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man, ⁸ knowing that whatever good anyone does, this he will receive back from the Lord, whether he is a bondservant or is free. ⁹ Masters, do the same to them, and stop your threatening, knowing that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and that there is no partiality with him.

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; ¹⁷ and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, ¹⁸ praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,

① **IS** WHAT CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE IS

Why is command of Xtian marriage put in ethical section?

Why are singles to wait to enjoy sexual intimacy till they are in a covenant marriage?

Why are wives commanded to submit to their husbands and respect her husband?

Why are husbands commanded to love their wives as Christ loved the church with a sacrificial + sanctifying love?

Why?

Because the reason for your marriage is not your happiness but your holiness. Marriage is about holiness! **Jenny saying NO!**

② **END** THE CHIEF END OF MARRIAGE

"end" not how to end marriage (divorce) or end well (death)
but the chief purpose or goal of marriage
"What is chief end of man..."

"so that he [Jesus] might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing, that she might be holy + w/o blemish." (5:27)

"Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. (5:31-32)

Mercy, Outreach and Justice has initiated a trial project in Indianapolis similar to a Habitat for Humanity house-building. It is a social purpose business called Faith of a Mustard Seed, or F.o.M.
