Confession of Sin

We confess our sin to remember that we are broken sinners who need a Savior. We can be vulnerable and confess with boldness because we know that God our Father loves and forgives us.

Lord God, author and finisher of our faith. You have given us the gift of faith. By faith are assured of what we hope for. By faith we are convicted of things we can't see. By faith we understand you created all things. And by faith we are commended by you.

But we struggle to trust you our God. We have a hard time living by faith.

Noah in reverent fear built and ark. We don't fear you enough to live in a way that is counter to and condemns the world.

Hebrews 11:1-7

⁴ By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. 5 By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. ⁶ And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. 7 By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

Heidelberg Catechism, Question and Answer #1
