The Five Kingdoms in Nebuchadnezzar's Dream (Daniel 2:31-35)

	Daniel 2:31-45	Daniel 7:1-18	Daniel 8:3-8
Babylon (2:38) explicitly states Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, is the head of gold - (Jer 49:19,22) describes Babylon as lion and eagle	Head (gold)	Lion (eagles wings)	
Medo-Persia - Cyrus/Darius ruled both Medes and Persia as a joint kingdom (see 6:8) - In (5:28) Daniel records the fall of Babylon to the Medes and Persians. - Persia was more dominant than Medes, which is why the bear in (7:5) was raised up on one side, and the ram in (8:3) had one horn higher than the other. - (8:20) explicitly identifies the ram with the Medo-Persian empire	Chest & Arms (silver)	Bear (leaning)	Ram (two horns, one bigger than the other)
Greece - Alexander the Great is the great horn on the goat in (8:21). When he died, he was succeeded by four of his generals. The four generals are represented by the leopard with 4 heads in (7:6) and the 4 horns that replace the great horn in (8:21) (8:21) explicitly identifies the goat with Greece	Middle & Thighs (bronze)	Leopard (4 heads)	Goat (great horn that becomes 4 horns)
Rome (Possible the clay represents Jewish leadership in Judea) - Never explicitly identified. - Historically we know Rome conquered Greece. - The establishment of the kingdom of God in (2:44) and (7:13) strongly suggests Rome is the 4 th kingdom.	Legs (iron) & Feet (iron & clay)	Beast (iron teeth)	
God's Eternal Kingdom - Jesus Christ is the stone which crushes the statue in 2:34,45 (see Luke 20:17-18). Christ's church is the mountain-temple that fills the earth, with Christ being the cornerstone (see 1 Pet 2:4-8; Eph 2:19-22). Christ is the exultant Son of Man in 7:13-14. This passage in Daniel is fulfilled in Christ's ascension and enthronement (see Acts 1:9; Acts 2:33; Heb 8:1).	Rock that progressively grows into a mountain	Son of Man
