

Assurance of Pardon



Sing praises to the Lord with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody.


With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the Lord.



Healing happens when we open ourselves to receive your grace. Open us. O God, and heal us in body, mind, or spirit according to your will. God of life, **You hear our prayer.**


We lift up all the saints who have gone before us, who have suffered until endurance produced hope. God of life, **You hear our prayer.**


