James Bible Study - Week 1 James 1:1-12

1 This letter is from James, a slave of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ.

I am writing to the "twelve tribes"—Jewish believers scattered abroad.

Greetings!

Faith and Endurance

2 Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. 3 For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. 4 So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing.

5 If you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and he will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking. **6** But when you ask him, be sure that your faith is in God alone. Do not waver, for a person with divided loyalty is as unsettled as a wave of the sea that is blown and tossed by the wind. **7** Such people should not expect to receive anything from the Lord. **8** Their loyalty is divided between God and the world, and they are unstable in everything they do.

9 Believers who are poor have something to boast about, for God has honored them. **10** And those who are rich should boast that God has humbled them. They will fade away like a little flower in the field. **11** The hot sun rises and the grass withers; the little flower droops and falls, and its beauty fades away. In the same way, the rich will fade away with all of their achievements.

12 God blesses those who patiently endure testing and temptation. Afterward they will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him.

- Who wrote the book of James under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit?
- How would it have been growing up in a house with Jesus? From the perspective of an unperfect sibling.
- The purpose of James is to teach, encourage and challenge.
- James blessed us with a new perspective on trials. Trials are tests that challenge and reveal the genuineness of one's faith.

- There are two directions our trials can take us:
 - Temptation, Sin & Death
 - Faith, Endurance & Maturity
- In our trials we are to find: God over them, Joy in them and wisdom through them.
- With trials it is when not if. These trials will be various... often, unpredictable and all shapes & sizes.
- We must understand that all trials have a purpose.
- Our trials produce... endurance, stronger faith, testimonies and ultimately maturity.
- James 1:5-8 The reason trials often overwhelm is is due to a lack of wisdom.
- A divided follower of Jesus is unstable at best.
- There is saving faith and Sustaining faith! Sustaining faith helps us to overcome doubt.
- James 1:9-10. We look for Jy in our stuff and seldom in our trials.
- Your net worth is not your self-worth. We count the outside, God counts the inside.
- Wealth and beauty pass and get buried with you.
- There are Godly Poor and Godly Rich, UnGodly Rich and Godly Rich.
- The world tries to divide and cause a class war saying all rich are oppressors and all the poor are oppressed. 2 Corinthians 2:8
- Joy is not found in your sin. James 1:12
