Introduction

- We've said that salvation is by faith alone
- We've said that salvation is for eternity
- So what does this salvation then look like?
- Paul has discussed how the consequences of our sin have been dealt with.
- Now he's going to talk about what we have to do about our sin going forward.



The Irony: We are Free From Sin Through Death (6:1-11)

- Continuing in Sin is not an Option (6:1-2a)
- Reason: We are crucified with Christ (2-7)
 - Baptism symbolizes this spiritual truth (v3)
 - Baptism should be outward confession of weighty decision (Gal 2:20)
 - Jesus characterized discipleship this way (Mat 16:24-25; John 12:24-25)
 - We emerge to walk in newness of life (4)
 - V5 is a big "IF" "United" means to plant and to join; innate oneness
 - United in death does not mean we experience His suffering. He bore that alone. But we experience death of the rule over our lives
 - When we actually do that, we are liberated from sin's grip (6-7).
 - We need to die daily (Luke 9:23)





- Sin, the king, is now defeated (12-14)
 - Sin is depicted as a king that ruled over us
 - But now we get to choose whether sin will rule over us (1 Cor 9:25-27)
 - Jesus warns about putting ourselves in this situation (Mat 18:8-9)
 - We overcome by "presenting" ourselves to God (13)
 - The result is that Sin Shall Not Have Dominion Over You (14) (John 8:34-36)

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Deliverance from the Dominion of Sin (12-23)

- Sin, the king, is now defeated (12-14)
- Sin, the master, is now deposed (15-23)
 - Question similar to v1, "Shall we sin [just a little]..."
 - Not just about being free from penalty of sin, but rather to be free from the bondage of sin
 - No freedom in a vacuum. We are either in bondage to sin or committed to righteousness.
 - "Presenting the members of your body..." means placing nearby our seat of desires and passions. We flirt with sin.
 - Dying to self means obedience from the heart to that form of teaching
