

## **Background for Romans**

- Written to an existing church of believers in Rome
- Tradition that it was founded by Peter (and Paul) is most likely incorrect
- Most likely founded by believers returning from Jerusalem after Pentecost
- Letter written from Corinth around 56 AD
- Carried to Rome by Phoebe (Rom 16:1-2)

### **Background for Romans**

- Not written to correct any bad behavior or misconceptions
- Rather it is a systematic description of the Gospel, its need, its content, its ramifications, and its results.

### The Greeting – Establishing Perspective

- Bond Servant of Jesus
  - doulos means slave
  - Hebrew equivalent would be ebed which means bond-servant
  - Paul was proud of his Roman citizenship and used it to advantage
  - In the Law, a bond-servant would be set free after 6 years
  - If the slave chose to remain with his/her master, they would be permanently made a bond-servant (Exo 21:5-6)

#### The Greeting – Establishing Perspective

- Bond Servant of Jesus
- Called as an Apostle
  - Called by God (Act 9:15; Gal 1:1)
  - Apostle means one who is sent (e.g. Phil 2:25, 2 Cor 8:23, John 13:16)
    - Apostle took on meaning of one given special authority
    - 2 requirements: Had seen the risen Lord (Acts 1:22) & had been called an apostle by Jesus (Acts 1:2-3) (also 1 Cor 9:1-2; 1 Cor 15:7-9; Gal 1:1)
    - Apostles spoke in place of the O.T. prophets (2 Pet 3:1-2)
    - Peter validates that Paul's writings are scripture (2 Pet 3:16)

# The Greeting — Establishing Perspective

- Bond Servant of Jesus -
- Called as an Apostle
- Separated Unto the Gospel of God
  - Greek word aphoridzo which means set apart, separated, excluded
  - Paul had been separated and excluded from his considerable bona fides (Phil 3:4-8)
