LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Reader : The prophet Isaiah tells us about the joy of ascending to God's house. The prophet tells us to imagine being set free, being unburdened, being released to live, to fully live in the grace and wonder of life itself, surrounded by those who love us like no one else. And then he tells us that the journey to get there is just as much a jov.

The Psalmist says "Happy are these whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord who made heaven and earth. Who keeps faith, who executes justice, gives food, sets prisoners free, opens eves, lifts up, watches over, and upholds. The Lord will reign forever, your God, O Zion, for all generations. Praise the Lord!" (Based on Psalm 146)

Reader: We light these candles, the candle of joyous hope, of proclaimed peace, and of deep and everlasting joy, as a sign that we are those who walk with a skip in our step because we can see the destination, and it is pure joy. We are ascending to God's promise.
