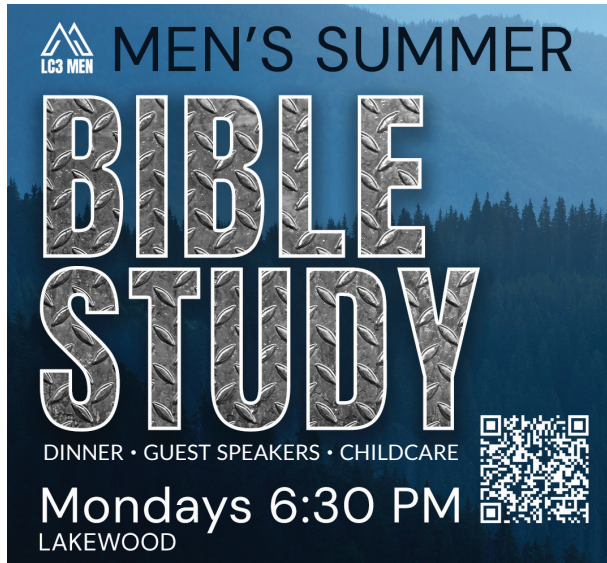


WELCOME GUESTS!

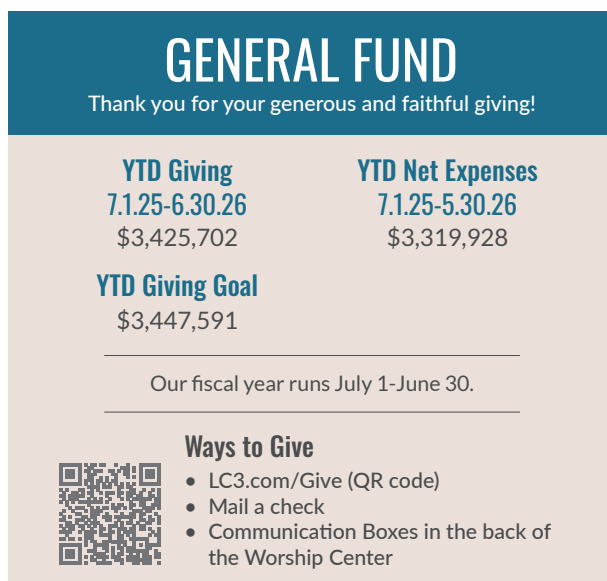

BECOMING WHOLE

Betrayal & Beyond Participant

When I said “for better or worse,” I believed love, commitment, and faith would carry us through anything. But I slowly came to understand that love cannot force transformation, and commitment cannot replace surrender.

My husband struggled with pornography in a way that reached far beyond private failure. It shaped his choices, his honesty, and his ability to remain faithful—not just physically, but emotionally and spiritually. Over time, I found myself living in a cycle of broken promises, hidden truths, and repeated grief. I prayed. I fasted. I hoped. I believed that if I held on long enough, God would restore what was broken.

There were moments when I saw glimpses of change, enough to keep my hope alive. But true repentance requires more than regret—it requires surrender. And surrender cannot be forced by another person’s faith, no matter how deep that faith may be.

Letting go was not a single decision. It was a long, painful process of recognizing reality, grieving what I had hoped for, and releasing the outcome to God. I wrestled with guilt, wondering if leaving meant I had failed. I questioned whether staying longer would somehow prove my faith or honor God more. But in the quiet, God reminded me that He is not honored by my destruction.

Healing began the moment I stopped trying to fix what was never mine to fix. I had to learn that I could trust God not only with my marriage, but with my future. I had to believe that His plans for me did not end in betrayal, but in restoration of my heart, my identity, and my peace.

Today, I am learning to live again—not as someone defined by betrayal, but as someone shaped by God’s faithfulness. I have found strength I did not know I had, and peace I did not think was possible. The Betrayal & Beyond group gave me a community to uphold me and encourage me.

I still believe in redemption. I still believe God can change any heart. But I also believe that my responsibility is to walk in obedience, to guard what God has entrusted to me, and to trust Him fully with the rest.

This is not the story I would have chosen. But it is the story where I found God in a deeper way than I ever knew before. And in Him, I am no longer lost—I am becoming whole.
