Review – The tribulation's purpose concerns Israel and not the Church

- 1. God has two distinct programs; one for Israel and another for the church (Dan. 12:7)
- 2. "The essence of Dispensationalism, then, is the distinction between Israel and the church." (Charles Ryrie, May/June 2007 article in Israel My Glory magazine)
- 3. Jeremiah 30:7; Daniel 9:24-27; Ephesians 3:9

- 1. Pre-tribulation Rapture view
- 2. Mid-tribulation Rapture view
- 3. Post-tribulation Rapture view
- 4. Partial Rapture view
- 5. Pre-wrath Rapture view

Reasons to trust in the Pre-Tribulation Rapture of the church

- 1. The tribulation's purpose concerns Israel (Jer. 30:7; Dan. 9:24)
- 2. It best explains the distinctions between the Rapture and the Second Coming
- 3. There is no biblical reference to the church on earth during the Tribulation (Rev. 4-22)
- 4. The church is ______ from God's wrath (Rev. 3:10; 6:17; Rom. 5:9; 1 Thess. 1:10; 5:9)
- 5. The Rapture is imminent (1 Cor. 15:51; 1 Thess. 4:15)
- 6. The Rapture is a comfort (1 Thess. 4:18)
- 7. The Antichrist cannot come to power until the restrainer is removed (2 Thess. 2:6-7)
- 8. The symbolic parallels (2 Peter 2:5-9)
 - All of these taken <u>together</u> provide a very convincing case!

The church is exempt from God's wrath

- 1. The Church is promised exemption from God's wrath
 - 1 Thess. 1:10
 - 1 Thess. 5:9
 - Romans 5:9
 - Romans 8:1
 - Rev. 3:10
- 2. The Tribulation is a time of God's wrath (Rev. 6:17)
- 3. The Mid-tribulation view the Rapture occurs at the mid-point of the Tribulation, which is at the 7th Trumpet (Rev. 11:15)
- 4. The Pre-wrath view of the Rapture the Rapture occurs at about 51/2 years (Rev. 6:17)
- 5. The wrath of God begins at the start of the Tribulation (Rev. 5:5-7)
- 6. Other arguments against the Mid-Trib Rapture view
 - The "saints" in Daniel 7:25 are not church age saints
 - The 7th trumpet of Rev. 11:15 is not the same as the last trump in 1 Cor. 15:52
 - Rev. 6:16-17 places God's "wrath" long before the middle of the Tribulation (11:15)
 - The only appearance of "great tribulation" in is Rev. 7:14, which is well before the Mid-Trib
 - The Mid-Trib view denies the doctrine of imminency (Titus 2:13)
