


- · We are seeing many patients receive comfort and hope through the sickle cell outreaches.

# PURSUED BY GOD CHARLENE "CHARLIE" PARTYKA

I can't remember a time when I didn't know about Jesus—but for most of my life, He was more of a historical figure than a personal Savior, I went to church regularly. but the message never really clicked. During my time at Fort Lewis. I attended chapel services mostly for the potluck and fellowship afterward. I still didn't truly understand who Jesus was or why it mattered.



That changed at age 32 when God quite literally stopped me in my tracks—by placing me in front of a moving vehicle. I was badly injured and spent three months in the hospital, two of those in traction. Despite the pain and uncertainty, I never once asked, "Why me?" One night, as I lay crying, I felt a hand on my shoulder—though no one was in the room. In that moment, I knew I wasn't alone. I left the hospital with a deep awareness of God's presence—and a growing realization that I had been forgiven. Though I still wasn't ready to fully surrender, I knew God was pursuing me.

Later, I remarried, moved to Gig Harbor, and began attending church. It was there that conviction finally took root, and I began the slow journey toward repentance. Studying Scripture with other believers, I came to understand that Jesus truly paid the price for my sins.

In 2010, I moved to Lakewood but continued commuting to my church in Gig Harbor until COVID made it difficult to stay connected. That's when I visited Lake City Community Church and from the first time I walked through the doors, I felt at home. I've learned more about Jesus here than anywhere else.

After retiring from Western State Hospital, I felt God calling me to serve. One Thursday in March 2021, I walked into the LC3 Gym and met Lucy. She asked if she could help me, and I replied, "Can I help you?" That moment led me to volunteer at the Bread of Life food bank. What began as obligation has become a joy. The friends I've made there have been a blessing from day one, and I'm so grateful I took that first step to join them in serving the Lord.
