People: Amen.

Leader: May our God keep you in His grace by the Holy Spirit, lead you in ways of faith and obedience, and finally bring you to live with Him forever, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

THE LITANY OF THANKSGIVING

Leader: We thank God for the land that is our home—a land of mountains and seashores, of rivers and forests. This is a rich and fruitful land, a land that has supplied generations with its bounty. The psalmist writes: “Let the redeemed of the LORD . . . thank the LORD for His steadfast love, for His wondrous works to the children of men” (Psalm 107:2a, 21).

Leader: We bless God for the peace that our nation has known on its shores for two and a half centuries. And we give our thanks for the generations of men and women who have lived devotedly and even died sacrificially to keep the freedoms that we enjoy and to maintain the peace that we know here in our land. As King David wrote in one of his psalms we pray: “You, O LORD, are a shield about me, my glory, and the lifter of my head” (Psalm 3:3).

Leader: We give glory to God for the United States that each of us knows, no matter what location in this vast country we call home. Confident of future blessings and with true thankfulness, we can echo the words of Psalm 126, which summed up the sentiment of God’s people: “The LORD has done great things for us; we are glad.”

Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. <sup>16</sup>Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with the law, that it is good. <sup>17</sup>So now it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. <sup>18</sup>For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. <sup>19</sup>For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. <sup>20</sup>Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. <sup>21</sup>So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. <sup>22</sup>For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being, <sup>23</sup>but I see in my members another law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. <sup>24</sup>Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? <sup>25</sup>Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

**Missionary Heidi Wilkinson to Give Ministry Minute this Weekend** - Emmanuel member and missionary to Ethiopia, Heidi Wilkinson, will address the congregation in each service this weekend. She will also be available to talk about her experience in Addis Ababa last year following each service.

**Reformation Treasures Return to Emmanuel** - Rare Reformation-era books from the Kessler Collection at Emory University’s Pitts Theology Library will be on display at Emmanuel in Ebenezer Hall on July 25, 10:00 a.m.–4:00 p.m. The exhibit, “From

Latin to the People: Reforming Worship in 16th-Century Germany,” features 16th-century catechisms, Bibles, Luther’s Deutsche Messe (1526), and other historic works. A multimedia lecture by Dr. Richard “Bo” Manly Adams and Dr. Armin Siedlecki will be presented at 2:00 p.m. in the sanctuary. Also featured are historical records of Emmanuel and artifacts from the Dornseif family, longtime members of the congregation. Open to the public.
