2. What is the main issue in verses 13-15 for those who have spoken against the Lord?
3. Do you find the issues from verses 13-15 relatable?
4. What makes the people of verse 16 different from those mentioned in verses 13-15?
5. How do you describe the fear of the Lord?
6. What is the book of remembrance?

Read Luke 23:27-43:

1. What are the “coming days” which Jesus mentions in verse 29?
2. What does Jesus’ statement in verse 34 mean to you?
3. Why does Pilate’s inscription for Jesus stand out for us at this point in the Church Year?
4. How does the criminals’ exchange strike you?
5. Why is verse 43 so important?

Read Colossians 1:13-20:

1. Who is the ‘He’ in verse 13?
2. What is the ‘domain of darkness’?
3. Who is the ‘He’ in verse 15?
4. What claims does this passage make about God the Father and God the Son?
5. Which claim stands out to you?

Devotional Thought:

Jesus was crucified that we may be spared the coming judgment, hear His word of absolution, and enter into paradise with Him. He not only saved others, but is also the messianic King who saves us. We all justly deserve God’s judgement because of our sinful deeds. Yet, because Jesus sacrificed Himself for us all, we have His word of absolution and the promise of being with Him in paradise (*adapted from TLSB, pg. 1769*).
