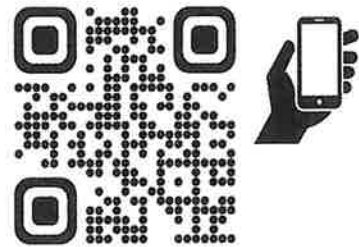

## THE FIRST READING: Acts 3:11-21

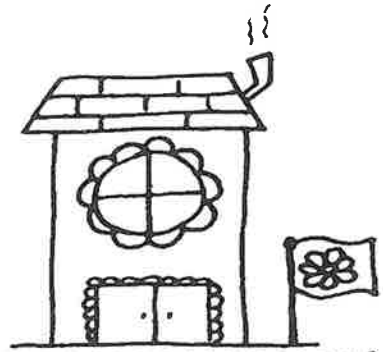
