



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**Read Exodus 24:8-18:**

1. What do you know about covenants?
2. Who made this covenant with whom? Israel with God or God with Israel?
3. How does this description of God's presence strike you?
4. If you were one of the people on this mountain, what would you be thinking?
5. What images come to mind when you think of the "glory of the Lord?"

**Read Matthew 17:1-9:**

1. If you were in the disciples, place what would you do when Jesus was transfigured?
2. Why is Peter's recognition of Moses and Elijah such a neat part of this account?
3. How does verse seven sit with you?
4. Why would Jesus command secrecy concerning this event?

**Read 2 Peter 1:16-21:**

1. How does Peter compare the prophetic word with his experience of the Transfiguration?
2. Why are verse twenty and twenty-one so important for us today?

**Devotional Thought:**

The transfiguration of Jesus confirms for the disciples that He truly is the Messiah, the Son of the living God, as Peter confessed. The transfiguration is a foretaste of coming glory: Christ's resurrection and His earthly appearance afterward, His ascension, and finally heaven. Comfort one another with these words. Though we are still troubled by the cares and ills of earthly life, every believer shares in the vision of what is to come (*adapted from TLSB, pg. 1619*).
