AS WE GATHER

The News of the Church

Reformation Treasures Return to Emmanuel - Rare Reformation-era books donated by a lifelong Emmanuel family are returning to the city from a major university collection. The donated books and other historically significant books that influenced and reflected the Protestant Reformation will be on exhibit at Emmanuel before returning to the Kessler Collection housed in the Pitts Theology Library at Emory University in Atlanta on July 25 and 26 in Ebenezer Hall. The theme of the exhibit is “From Latin to the People: Reforming Worship in 16th-

Century Germany.” Dr. Richard “Bo” Manly Adams, Director of the Pitts Library, and Dr. Armin Siedlecki, Head of Rare Book Cataloging, have organized the exhibit and will be giving a multimedia lecture with that title at 2:00 p.m. in Emmanuel’s sanctuary. Around that theme, the exhibit will include 16th-century catechisms, period Bibles, a 1526 printing of Luther’s Deutsche Messe, and earlier tracts influencing Luther’s Order of Service, including the Lord’s Supper. Also on display will be historic records of Emmanuel Lutheran Church, and historical photos and artifacts of the Dornseif family, who brought the books to America as German immigrants in the mid-1800s and who eventually settled in Fort Wayne. Members of the extended Dornseif family have attended Emmanuel for four generations. The exhibit will be open to the public on July 25, from 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

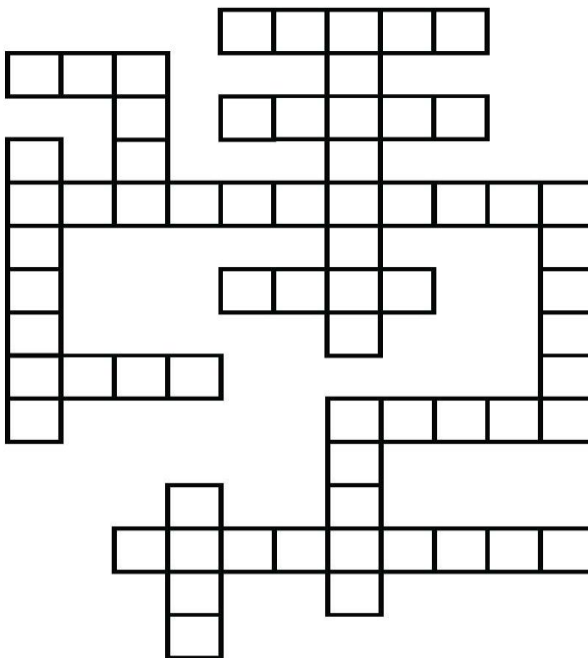

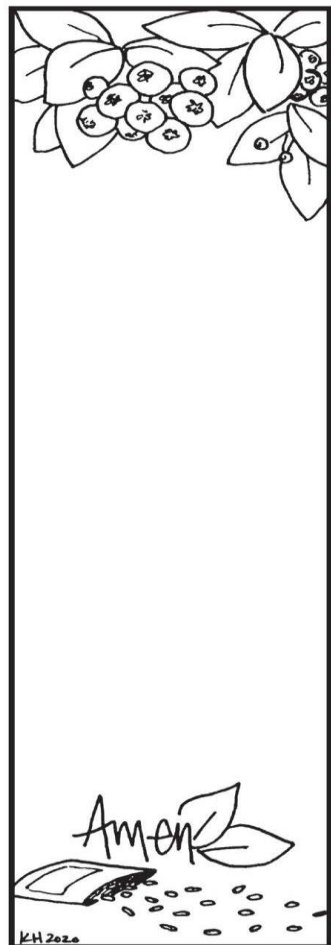
