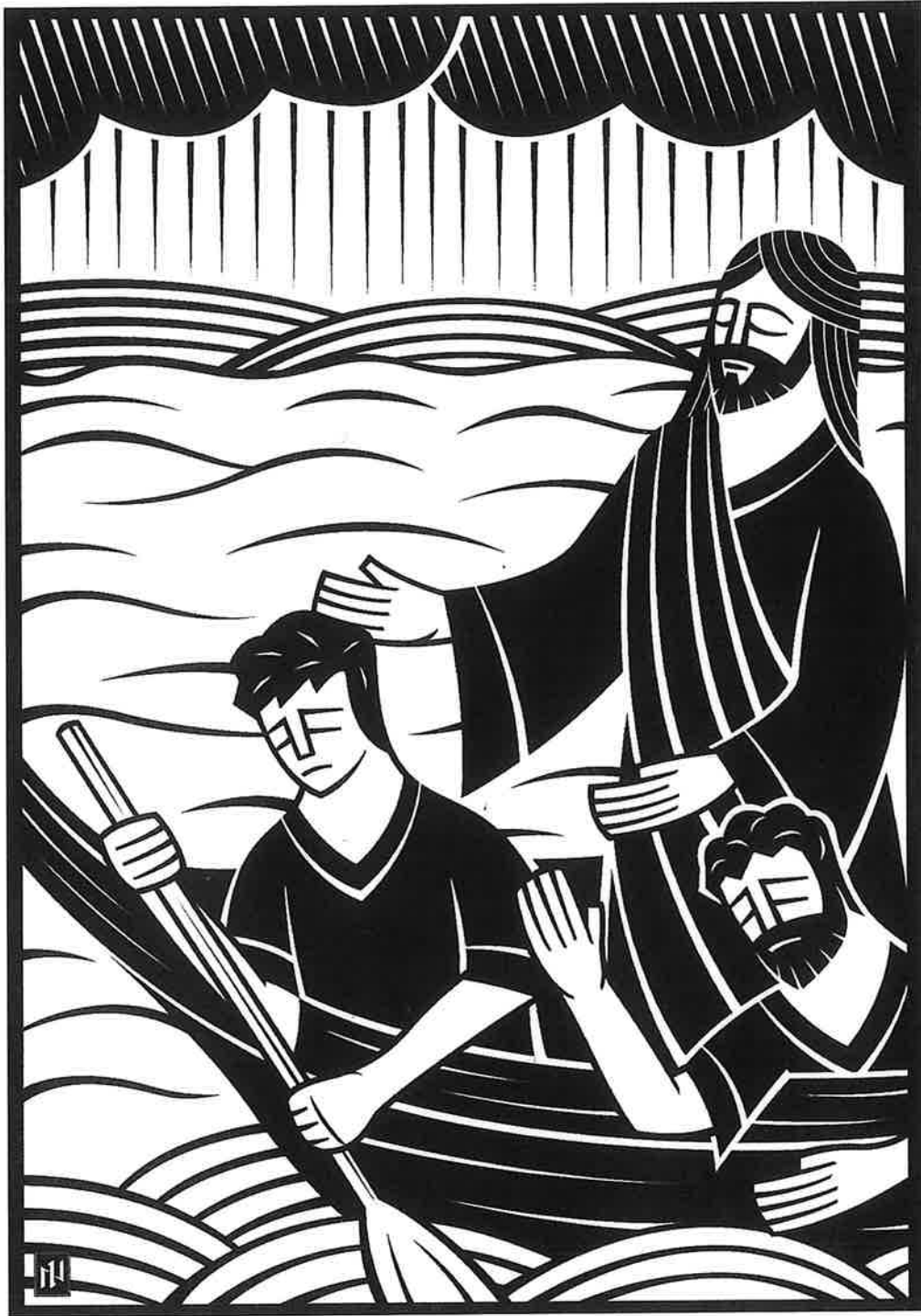

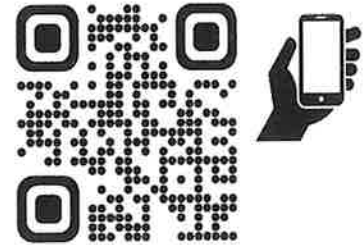

AS WE GATHER

In today’s Gospel reading, the disciples respond to a sudden storm by asking Jesus a question that borders on an accusation, “Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?” Jesus answers their loaded question by calming the storm with the words, “Peace! Be still!” In this saving act, Jesus displays His divine identity and removes any doubt that He always cares about those who are perishing. Today, Jesus comes to us with this same saving word of peace.

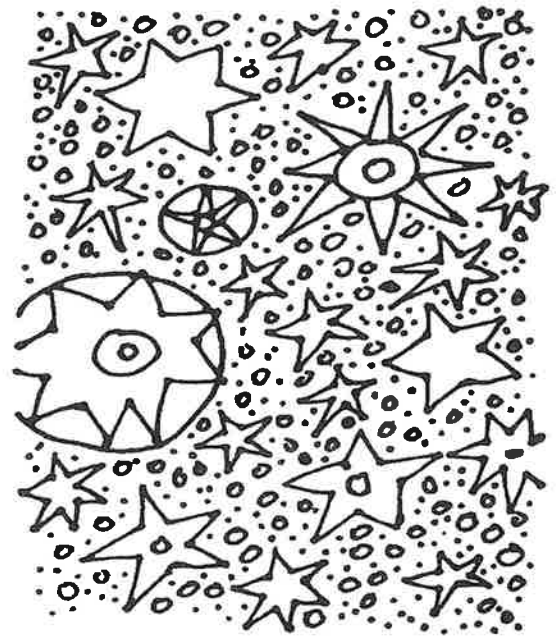

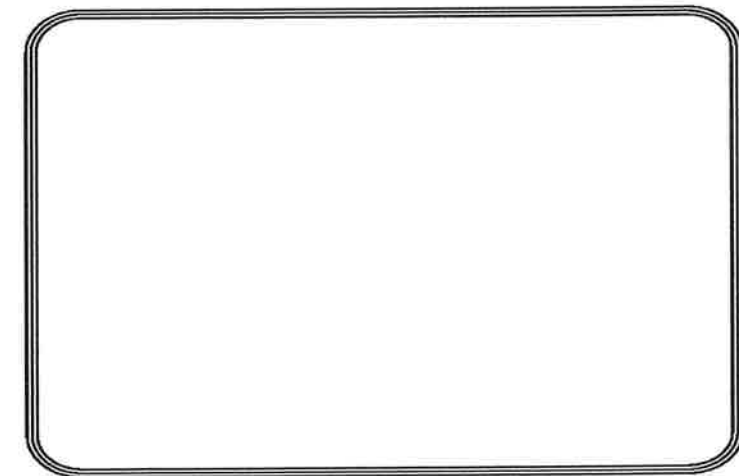
