
Pastor's Bible Study

LSB 507 Holy, Holy, Holy



Read Isaiah 6:1-8:

- 1. Does Isaiah's vision connect you to other Bible accounts? If so, which ones?
- 2. How does this reading connect to the emphasis on the Trinity this weekend?
- 3. Who was King Uzziah?
- 4. Why do you think the seraphim cover so much of themselves?
- 5. Isaiah's experience reminded him of God's holiness, what experiences have reminded you of God's holiness?

Read Acts 2:14a, 22-36:

- 1. Based on context, can you figure out why verse 14a is included?
- 2. How does Peter confess the Trinity in this part of his sermon?
- 3. What is the major work of the Triune God highlighted in this section of Peter's sermon?
- 4. How does this work show that humanity remains the Triune God's biggest concern?
- 5. Why is Peter's remark in v. 36 so important?

Read John 3:1-17:

- 1. How might Nicodemus' struggle to understand be helpful for this Trinity weekend?
- 2. How does this passage highlight the Triune God?

Devotional Thought:

The Lord appears to Isaiah and calls him as a prophet. In your Baptism and through the Word, the Lord calls you too as His messenger. Relate to others what you have heard and seen about the Lord. Do not let the shame of past sins silence you. The Lord Jesus has made atonement for you in the tabernacle of God's presence on high (adapted from TLSB, pg. 1098-1099).

Prayer:

Touch my mouth, O Savior, that I may sing: 'Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and might: Heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna. Hosanna in the highest.' Amen. (LSB, p 161).
