
Worship and Bible Class this Weekend

Emmanuel Calls Pastor Sam Troemel



Following the vote of the congregation on February 13, to approve a fulltime, called position for Youth and Family Ministry, Congregational President Dave Smith worked with our pastors to form and appoint a call committee. The committee was chaired by Matthew Konow and included the following members of Emmanuel: Richie Cummins, Shelly Habecker, Lana Hille, Ike Imler, River Johnson, Tim Lankenau, Bradley Murphy, Anna Pennekamp, Sarah Pennekamp, and Jenny Scheiderer. Pastor Eggold,

Pastor Sheafer, and Dave Smith all served as ex-officio members of the call committee. Working with the ministry description approved by the congregation, the call committee began their task by gathering names through the Synod's Commissioned Minister Information Form (CMIF) database. Applying filters to the CMIF database a list of more than a hundred names was generated. A list of 11 candidates suggested by congregation members was added to the names taken from the CMIF database creating a master list of 126 names. The committee then began the vetting process by contacting the office of the Indiana District President to gather information about call eligibility. The list was then narrowed to less than 10 after prayerful study and discussion of the eligible candidates. After personally contacting each of the remaining candidates, eight candidates declined invitations to formally interview. The two remaining candidates participated in a brief interview with Mrs. Pennekamp and Pastor Eggold. Following these conversations, one of the two asked to be removed from consideration.

The remaining candidate was interviewed on April 12, by a group which included eight of the committee members. Following the discussion with the candidate, the committee processed the interview, prayed, and voted unanimously to present Pastor Sam Troemel to the congregation for consideration and issuance of a Divine Call to serve Emmanuel Lutheran Church as Youth and Family Pastor. On Sunday, April 24, the congregation approved the recommendation of the call committee and voted to extend a divine call to Rev. Troemel. Rev. Troemel currently serves Calvary Lutheran Church in Indianapolis, in the same specific ministry pastoral role for which Emmanuel is calling. Sam has been at Calvary since 2017. While originally called as the Youth and Family Director, Sam was ordained through his training in the SMP (Specific Ministry Pastor) program and has been serving as the Youth and Family Pastor since 2021. A West Lafayette native, Sam attended Concordia University Chicago where he studied Christian Education and Elementary Education. It was in Chicago where he met his wife, Molly (Peterson), who is a daughter of Emmanuel and currently serves as Calvary's junior high social studies teacher. Sam and Molly have been married since 2015 and have a son named Levi. Please pray for Sam and Molly as they seek the Lord's will for their continued service in His Church.
