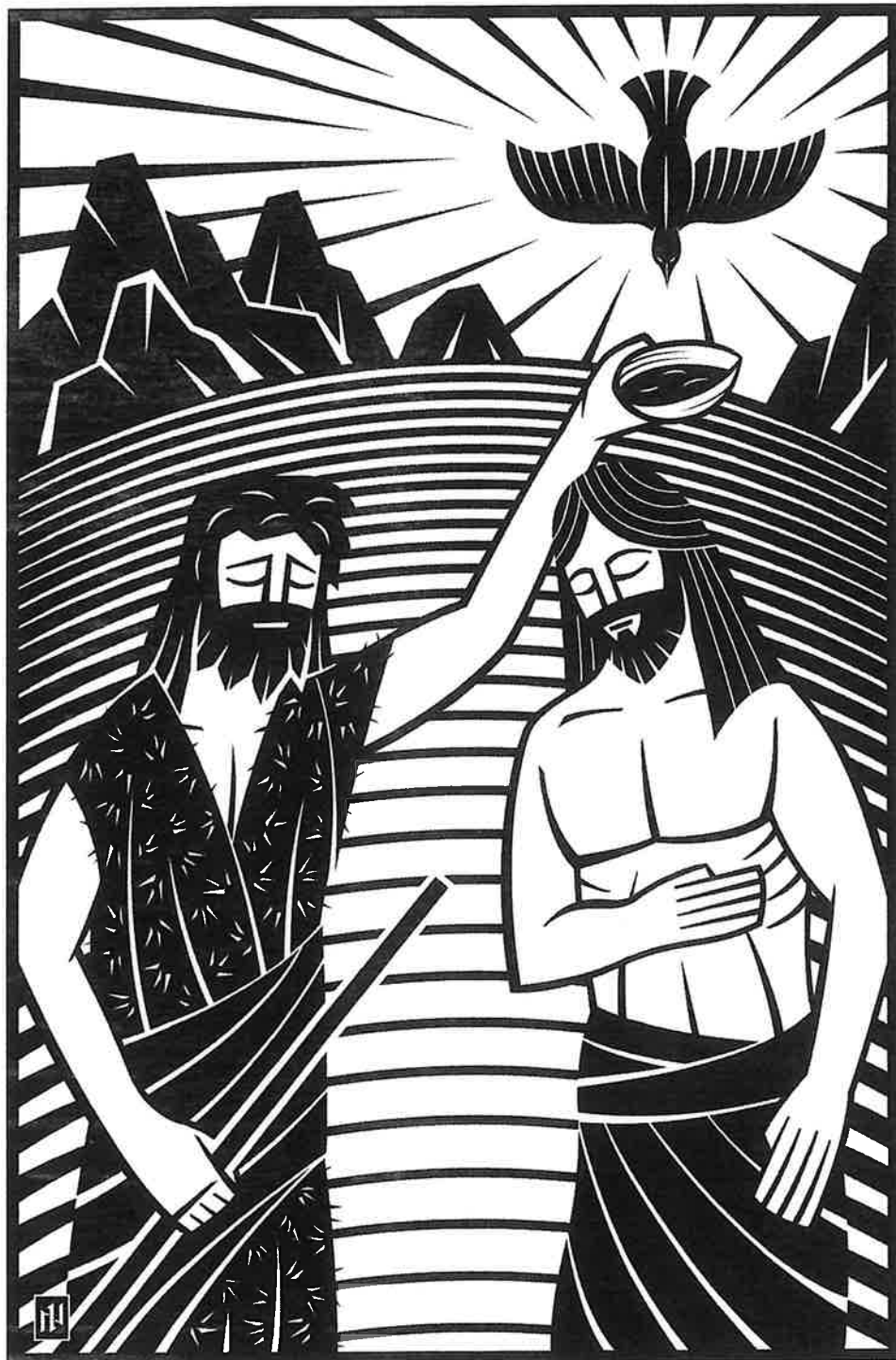

As we ponder this gift, allow these words to guide your reflection: “The gifts Christ freely gives / He gives to you and me / To be His Church, His bride, / His chosen, saved and free! / Saints blest with these rich gifts / Are children who proclaim / That they were won by Christ / And cling to His strong name. / The gifts flow from the font / Where He calls us His own; / New life He gives that makes / Us His and His alone. / Here He forgives our sins / With water and His Word; / The Triune God Himself / Gives pow’r to call Him Lord (Lutheran Service Book #602, stanzas 1-2).

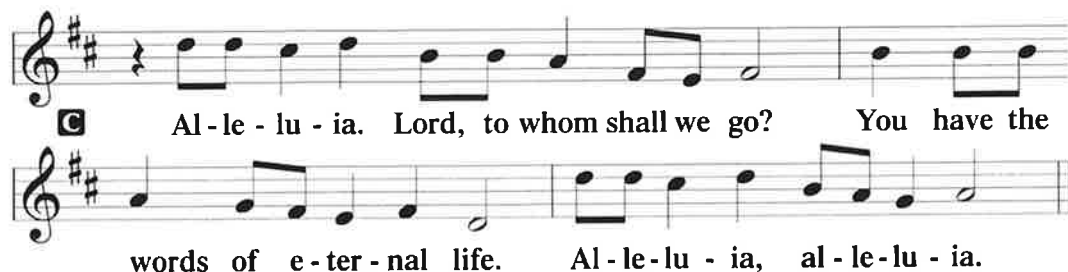
THE SECOND READING: Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For one who has died has been set free from sin. ⁸Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

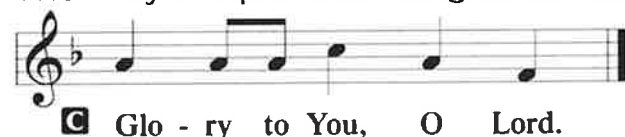

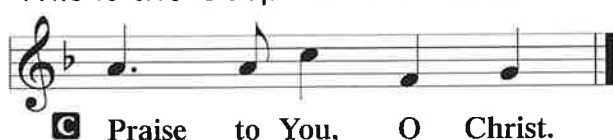

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Classes

- **Lutheran Christianity** (January 4-March 29; Teachers - Eggold, Sheafer, Hille; Location - Brandt Hall) is a class designed to help build a solid foundation in the core teachings of the Church and is offered to anyone interested in learning more about the Lutheran Christian faith or brush up on what they had learned at another point in their faith journey.

- **Galatians** (January 4-March 22; Teacher - Pastor Dennis McFadden; Location - LL Ebenezer) Join us for a 12-week study of St. Paul's letter to the Galatians. This letter has been called the "Magna Carta of Christian liberty," for it maintains that only through the grace of God received through faith in Jesus Christ can a person escape the curse of sin and of the law and live a new life, not in bondage or license, but in a genuine freedom of mind and spirit through the power of God. Galatians was a favorite epistle of reformer Martin Luther who called it his "Katie" (Luther's wife!). Our class will involve PowerPoint presentation, video clips, and discussion.
- **Living Faithfully in a Fallen World: Being Lutheran after Luther's Death** (January 4 - February 8; Teacher - Pastor Larry Rast; Location - Sanctuary) We all know that Luther posted the 95 Theses in 1517-but what happened after that? This study will look at the latter part of Luther's life and then examine the enormous challenges the Lutheran church faced in the years following his death (1546) and when things finally (kind of) settled down in 1580. Over the weeks we will see how God keeps His promises to His church—even when His church struggles with the difficulties of living faithfully in a fallen world.

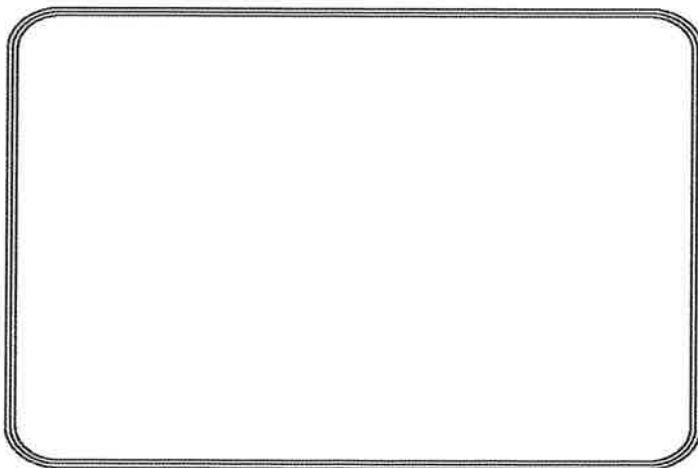
