Mrk39 - Pure Desperate Faith - Mark 10:46-52

I think this is our <u>FIFTH Message</u> - in <u>Mark Ch 10</u> Because This - is a <u>power-packed chapter</u>

But listen - I want us to HEAR this again

In <u>this Gospel</u> – <u>Mark</u> (by the <u>Holy Spirit</u>) puts <u>Events</u> together (he <u>orders</u> them <u>together</u>)

in order to tell a story - or get a critical truth across

<u>It's been</u> true <u>already once</u> – <u>In This Ch</u>

In the contrast betweenhow a CHILD approaches Jesusvs how a RICH PERSON approaches Jesus

& <u>Mark started</u> another "<u>Contrast Teaching</u>" last <u>week</u> <u>In</u> our <u>msg</u> titled "<u>Selfish Ambition</u>"

the "other shoe drops' half

of the Life-Changing Truth
that Mark set us up for - last message

<u>These 2 Msgs</u> together - <u>Provide</u> a <u>Stark Contrast</u> between <u>Selfish Ambition – & – Pure Desperate Faith ?</u>

Let's Pray

One Scholar (James Edwards) – who has focused on teaching Mark in Seminary for many years – says:

James Edwards

The healing of Bartimaeus is surely the sum and center of all that Mark desires to convey about faith and discipleship.

So – <u>this</u> is <u>NOT</u> just another <u>healing</u> "because Jesus is compassionate" <u>Story</u>

& we will **REALLY see that** – as we **contrast Today's text With** the **msg** from **last week**

<u>Last week</u> – <u>Jesus</u> was on <u>the Road</u> <u>Headed</u> toward <u>Jerusalem</u> – <u>AND the Cross</u>

<u>Today</u> – <u>Jesus</u> (& the crowd with him) <u>REACH Jericho</u> - & <u>LEAVE Jericho</u>

The **LAST CITY**

Between Jesus - & the Triumphal Entry

Mark 10:46 (NLT)

46 Then they reached Jericho, and as Jesus and his disciples left town, a large crowd followed him . . .

Jericho is 20 miles and 3,500 feet in elevation BELOW Jerusalem

& it is the LAST City - Before you go - UP to Jerusalem

& **this** is the **LAST Miracle**That **Mark records** in his **Gospel**

So - This is IT - in the Traveling Ministry of Jesus

Next Week – is the *Triumphal Entry* & the **Beginning** of *Passion Week*

& a **LARGE Crowd** is now **following** Jesus

Because the **FAME** of **Jesus** - is at **its peak**

In the <u>NEXT Section</u> – <u>This Crowd</u> will be <u>Shouting Hosanna</u> & <u>Spreading Palm Fronds</u> out for him

So <u>Jesus</u> – <u>AND</u> the <u>Large Crowd</u> Following Him Are <u>Leaving Jericho</u> – <u>Heading Up to Jerusalem</u>

& then - Mark 10:46(b) says (NLT)

46 . . . A blind beggar named <u>Bartimaeus</u> (which means) (son of Timaeus) was sitting beside the road.

Bartimaeus is the <u>ONLY</u> person <u>Healed</u> – in <u>Mat</u>, <u>Mark</u>, <u>Luke</u> who's name is <u>recorded</u> in the <u>Word of God</u>

Which would typically mean something memorable is about to happen

So "Blind Bartimaeus" was sitting BESIDE the road Probably with his cloak spread out

& **people** would **throw** a **small coin** or **piece of bread** to them - as they **walked** by

So Bartimaeus is Sitting BESIDE the Road

He's on the OUTSIDE

He's on the FRINGE of what's happening

He's **SIDE-LINED** from society

But - one thing we Quickly Learn about Blind Bartimaeus

ALTHO he had <u>0/0 Physical Sight</u>
He had <u>20/20 Spiritual Sight</u>

We **see** it **first** - in his **EXCITEMENT when** he **hears** that **Jesus** is **Passing By**

Mark 10:47 (NLT)

47 When Bartimaeus heard that Jesus of Nazareth was nearby, he <u>began to shout</u>, "Jesus, <u>Son of David</u>, have mercy on me!"

In **2 Sam 7** – **God** promised **King David**

that the <u>Savior of Israel</u> – The <u>Messiah</u> would come from the *Linage of King David*

& so - "Son of David" became a term for The Messiah

& <u>certainly</u>, <u>Bartimaeus</u> had <u>heard</u> of <u>the FAME</u> of <u>Jesus</u> of <u>Nazareth</u>

of the <u>Miraculous Healings</u> <u>wherever</u> he <u>went</u> – & <u>His Teachings</u> like <u>One</u> sent <u>Directly</u> from <u>God</u>

& - <u>somewhere</u> in those <u>testimonies</u>

Blind Bartimaeus had CHOSEN to Believe

He had chosen to SEE Jesus - as The Messiah
Tho he could NOT SEE him - Physically

Is it that any different for US?

Thru his <u>Miracles</u>
& thru his <u>Miraculous Word</u>

You & I must Also CHOOSE to SEE Jesus as Messiah
Tho we CANNOT See him Physically

& that's not all we must do
That's the same as Blind Bartimaeus

Because **Bartimaeus** – **Also** Begins **CRYING OUT** to Jesus

Knowing the **Savior** – Would **NOT pass** that **way again**

Bartimaeus was Desperate

To have Jesus HEAR his Cries for MERCY

& **so** the **people Started DOING** – what **people** – **Start DOING**

Mark 10:48 (NLT)

48 "Be quiet!" many of the people yelled at him . . .

What is WRONG with you Bartimaeus?

<u>Can't</u> you just quietly <u>SPECTATE</u> here like the rest of us?

Why do you have to be all - "Crying Out to Jesus"?

But <u>when</u> a <u>person</u> Knows – that they've <u>GOT to REACH</u> the <u>Savior</u>

Because they <u>SO BADLY NEED</u> the <u>Mercy of God</u> in their <u>lives</u>

They are <u>no longer Spectating</u> – They are <u>no longer Watching</u>

& they are going to Continue to Cry Out to Jesus
Until they RECEIVE the Mercy of God – they NEED

& so we read in - Mark 10:48(b) (NLT)

48... But he only shouted louder, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"

& <u>The more</u> the <u>people</u> tried to <u>Silence Him</u>
That <u>louder</u> he <u>shouted</u>, "Jesus, have mercy on me!"

This is a man who KNOWS his current condition

& he <u>knows</u> the <u>only one</u> who can <u>SAVE HIM</u> <u>IS PASSING BY</u> – right <u>now</u>

This is HIS CHANCE
maybe his One & Only Chance

& he is determined to REACH the Savior

& God will ALWAYS hear

That Cry for Mercy – ALWAYS

AND - a Genuine CRY for God's Mercy will always STOP the Lord in His Tracks

Mark 10:49 (NLT)

49 When Jesus heard him, <u>he stopped</u> and said, "Tell him to come here." . . .

The SON Stood Still for this Blind Beggars Cry for Mercy

& <u>if YOU</u> will put <u>YOURSELF</u> in this <u>Blind Beggars PLACE</u>

The SON will Stand Still for YOU too

<u>Jesus Stopped</u> – He <u>Stood Still</u> – & **He CALLED** this **Blind Beggar** to **himself**

- > <u>Bartimaeus chose</u> to <u>BELIEVE</u>

 <u>what</u> he had <u>heard</u> about <u>Jesus</u>
- > <u>Then</u>, when <u>Jesus</u> was <u>NEAR</u>, <u>Bartimaeus</u> began <u>Crying Out</u> to him & he would <u>NOT Stop</u>
- > Then, Jesus CALLED Bartimaeus to himself
- > & Then Bartimaeus *HEARD the Call*

Mark 10:49(b) (NLT)

49... So they called the blind man. "Cheer up," they said. "Come on, he's calling you!"

"Come on Bartimaeus, the LORD is calling you!"

- & When you Cry Out to Jesus
 With Unrelenting Determination
- & then you hear the Lord Calling You

You do just what Bartimaeus did

Mark 10:50 (NLT)

50 Bartimaeus <u>threw aside his coat</u>, jumped up, and <u>came to</u> Jesus.

<u>To a Beggar</u> – <u>His coat</u> (cloak) <u>was</u> (for sure) his <u>most</u> <u>valued possession</u>

& he willingly threw it aside in order to RUN to Jesus

He <u>jumped up</u> – <u>Stumbling around</u> -<u>Led</u> by <u>those</u> who had <u>come to him</u> – <u>heart pounding</u>

Until Finally – he was Face-to-Face with God in the Flesh

& <u>I'm sure Bartimaeus</u> could **SENSE Jesus** in **front** of him

But Jesus - was looking right past those sightless eyes right into Bartimaeus' SOUL

& then - Mark 10:51 (NLT)

51 "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked . . .

<u>Mark that</u> – <u>because</u> it is the <u>exact same question</u> <u>Jesus</u> asked <u>2 of his Disciples</u> - <u>Last Week</u>

Again - Mark 10:51 (NLT)

51 "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked. "My Rabbi," the blind man said, "I want to see!"

The word translated "My Rabbi" - is Rabboni

<u>It's</u> the <u>same term Mary</u> used at <u>the tomb</u> when she <u>Recognized Jesus</u>

It's unique because

it <u>expresses</u> a "<u>Personal Relationship</u>" with <u>The Teacher</u> (which is why NLT = "<u>My Rabbi</u>)

& so – Blind Bartimaeus says "My Savior – My Teacher, I Want To See"

Have WE done that?

Have we Cried Out (relentlessly) to the Lord for His Mercy?
Have we Heard His CALL - & have we COME to Him?

& <u>Have</u> we <u>said</u> to Him – "My Savior & My Lord – I want to SEE"

I want to see <u>YOU</u> more Clearly, Lord
I want to see <u>YOUR Ways</u> (& your Kingdom), more clearly
I want to see <u>YOU</u>, I want to <u>KNOW you</u>

Blind Bartimaeus KNEW Exactly what he needed from the Lord

He KNEW his **Own True Condition**

& <u>he KNEW</u> he <u>needed</u> to be <u>HEALED & SAVED</u> – <u>BY the Lord</u>

& the Lord - RESPONDED

Mark 10:52 (NLT)

52 And Jesus said to him, "Go, for your faith has <u>healed</u> you." Instantly the man <u>could see</u> . . .

Bartimaeus, your faith has <u>healed</u> you . . .

the **word Translated Healed** is **SOZO** It **means** to **HEAL** - or to **SAVE**

Your Faith has <u>HEALED you</u> Your Faith has <u>SAVED you</u>

& Instantly the man could see . . .

& the <u>Very FIRST THING</u> he saw <u>was</u> the <u>FACE of JESUS</u>

So - <u>Bartimaeus</u> <u>was HEALED</u>, & He <u>was SAVED</u> & then v<u>.52 says</u>

Mark 10:52(b) (NLT)

52 . . . and he followed Jesus down the road.

He <u>left</u> his <u>life</u> as a <u>Blind Beggar</u>

and he Followed Jesus Down the Road

- & Bartimaeus SAW the Triumphal Entry
- & **he SAW** the **Horror** of **The Cross**
- & he SAW the Triumph of The Resurrection
- & Some Scholars believe

Instead of "Blind Bartimaeus" – "Seeing Bartimaeus"
became a Vital Part of the Jerusalem Church

Blind Bartimaeus did Everything RIGHT

- > He **Recognized** his **Own Need**
- > He **Recognized Jesus as the Savior** from God
- > He <u>Cried Out</u> to Jesus with <u>Unrelenting Persistence</u>
- > He *Responded* when Jesus called him
- > & He Left his Old Life Behind to Follow Jesus
- & Blind Bartimaeus is an AWESOME Example
- of **Exactly** How **WE** should **COME to Jesus AND** How **WE** should **Follow Jesus**

BUT – There's MORE We Can We Learn From This Text

There's a a Critical Comparison Here
That it seems MARK is trying to Get Across to us

Look again at **Vs 51**

Where **Jesus** says to **Bartimaeus**

Mark 10:51 (NLT)

51 "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked. "My Rabbi," the blind man said, "I want to see!"

Bartimaeus says

I'm BLIND - and I want to SEE

I'm **LOST** - and I want to **Be FOUND**

I'm SIDELINED in life - & I want to FOLLOW Jesus

The SIMPLICITY of His Desire & the PERSISTENCE of his Faith

are Absolutely MOVING

But Now - Look back up at Mark 10:36

Where Jesus asks James & John –

Two of his top leading disciples – the same question

Mark 10:36 (NLT)

36 "What is your request?" he asked.

The Key Words in these Two Vs's are exactly the SAME

So they COULD Be Translated - Exactly the Same

& So - As Mark often does

He's stringing Two Events together
In order to show us an incredible CONTRAST

When Jesus asked Blind Bartimaeus this Question

It's clear, that Bartimaeus wanted desperately

To be *Healed*,

To be **Saved**,

& to *Follow Jesus*

When Jesus asked <u>Two</u> of his <u>Leading Disciples</u> the <u>Exact same question</u>

It's <u>clear</u> – the <u>Disciples</u> wanted <u>Power</u>, <u>Prestige</u>, & <u>Glory</u>

Who do you think was REALLY BLIND in these two situations?

WAS IT Was it the Blind Man Crying Out in his Brokenness & his Lostness

To be **Saved**, & **Healed**, & to be able to **Follow Jesus?**

OR WAS IT the Arrogant Leaders of the Disciples

Who wanted **Power**, **Prestige**, & **Glory**?

Often, when we get 'too comfortable' in Ministry

We begin to lose the understanding of our intense need for Salvation & God's Grace

We forget - that when Jesus called us

We were **spiritually Blind Beggars sitting** on the **Side of the Road**

& <u>when</u> we <u>Forget</u> – <u>WHO we ARE</u> & <u>WHERE</u> We've <u>Come from</u>

Our requests to the Lord can easily become requests of Selfish Ambition

which is exactly what we saw from James & John last week

Don't DO that – Don't Do That

Never Forget

You were <u>BLIND</u> to <u>Spiritual Life</u> & <u>Jesus Made</u> you <u>SEE</u>

You were LOST & Jesus FOUND you

You were SIDELINED - & Jesus called you to FOLLOW Him

& when Jesus asks you "What do you Want me to do for you?"

Tell Him – Nothing More Jesus

Than for you to SAVE Me - & HEAL Me & allow me to FOLLOW you every day of my life

Mark has given us an incredible CONTRAST of

HOW NOT to *Come to Jesus

* HOW TO *Come to Jesus**

Please <u>hear me</u> when <u>I say</u>
<u>Blind Bartimaeus</u> - <u>Got it RIGHT</u>

Let's Pray - that WE will too
