Let's Pray

At the end of <u>Ch 3</u> – we were <u>strongly encouraged</u> with our <u>Heavenly Citizenship</u> – it's privileges & responsibilities

& then **<u>Ch.4 V.1</u>** begins with the transitional word – "*therefore*"

<u>Phil 4:1</u>

1 Therefore [because of the truths of Ch 3], my beloved and longed-for brethren, my joy and crown, so <u>stand fast in the Lord</u>, beloved.

Look at the love Paul had for the Philippian saints

His "*beloved & longed-for brethren*" – his "*joy & crown*"

<u>These beloved saints (that he's laid down his life for)</u> are his <u>joy today</u> -& will be his <u>heavenly crown</u> when he finishes his race

So Paul says <u>STAND FAST</u> in the Lord Don't <u>waver</u> – Don't <u>stop</u> – Don't <u>fall away</u> - <u>Stand Fast</u>

& then – <u>in V.2</u> - we see a <u>hint</u> of why Paul <u>began</u> with that <u>loving encouragement</u> to <u>Stand Fast</u>

We also <u>see</u> – <u>the beginning</u> of a lesson <u>Every Single One Of Us</u> needs to learn

<u>The truths</u> described here will bring victory over <u>1 of the enemy's</u> <u>favorite tools</u> to bring <u>damage</u> into the church

The context of this passage is set - HERE - in V.2

Where <u>**Paul</u>** begins by <u>addressing two women</u> in the church who were <u>having a conflict</u> – <u>a dispute</u></u>

<u>Phil 4:2</u>

2 I implore Euodia and I implore Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord.

Euodia & **Syntyche** – apparently were *prominent women* in the church

<u>Euodia</u> (yoo-oh´dee-uh) = "<u>prosperous journey</u>" <u>Syntyche</u> (sin'ti-kee) = "<u>pleasant acquaintance</u>"

& it appears these women were both prosperous & pleasant

<u>They may</u> very well have been <u>deaconesses</u> – or <u>possibly</u> even each had <u>house churches</u> in their own homes

In any case they were **prominent** members of the church & <u>they represent</u> the <u>prime example</u> of <u>what Paul</u> has been <u>referring to</u> throughout his letter

The <u>crucial teaching</u> that Paul is driving home here in <u>Ch 4</u> he has been <u>clearly sowing</u> <u>thru-out</u> the entire book

(look over) Phil 1:27

27 Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of your affairs, that you <u>stand fast in one spirit</u>, with <u>one mind</u> <u>striving together</u> for the faith of the gospel,

(& then) Phil 2:2-4

2 fulfill my joy by being <u>like-minded</u>, having the <u>same love</u>, being of <u>one accord</u>, of <u>one mind</u>.

3 Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each <u>esteem others better</u> than himself. 4 Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the <u>interests of others</u>.

<u> Again - Phil 4:2</u>

2 I implore Euodia and I implore Syntyche to be of <u>the same mind</u> in the Lord.

<u>The word implore is a very strong Greek word</u> we might say; "<u>I beg you</u>, from the bottom of my heart" "<u>please</u>, be of the same mind"

The phrase *"be of the same mind"* is the same used back in <u>Ch.2 V.2</u> – <u>*"Be Like-Minded"*</u>

- **<u>LIT</u>** = "think the same thing"
- So with <u>**THAT**</u> context in mind we're about to read some of the <u>most-quoted</u> Vs's in the N.T.

They're used all the time - in all kinds of circumstances . . .

But maybe **not often enough** are they used in the <u>specific context</u> they're written in

Which is **UNITY** between *individual members* in the church

Paul is about to give some of the best advise in scripture on how we can **STOP CONFLICTS** - & - **STAND IN UNITY** *with one another* in the church

So - - - when the Holy Spirit says -"<u>be of the same mind</u>" - "<u>think the same thing</u>" . . .

- If you're wondering what He's getting at let's *just skim thru* the next Vs's *w/ this thought* of UNITY in mind
- Paul's saying <u>IF</u> we'll have <u>THIS</u> same mind (*he's about to describe*) <u>then</u> . . . we will be able to minister in <u>UNITY</u> in the church

Here is Paul's description of having the same mind <u>follow along as we skim over it</u> – then we'll look at each Vs. in detail

Paul is urging these two women to have <u>THIS</u> Same Mind

- (**v.4**) Rejoice in the Lord always
- (<u>v.5</u>) Let your gentleness be known to all
- (<u>v.6</u>) Be anxious for nothing, but in everything – by Prayer, Supplication, & Thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God
- (v.7) & the peace of God will guard your hearts & minds thru Christ Jesus
- (<u>v.8</u>) Whatever is <u>True</u> <u>Noble</u> <u>Just</u> <u>Pure</u> <u>Lovely</u> of Good Report - Virtuous - & Praise Worthy

Meditate on these things - - Lock your mind on these things

These are *incredible Vs's* –

& they are great Vs's to be used in every situation in life

- Pam & I had these Vs's on our Fridge for <u>6 years</u> while we prayed God would <u>allow us to have children</u> & they gave us <u>great peace</u> during that time
- & I <u>strongly encourage you</u> to <u>apply</u> these Vs's to <u>every stressful area</u> of your life – because they <u>really do apply</u>
- But, <u>for today</u>, I'd like us to <u>look at the power</u> of these Vs's <u>IN THE CONTEXT</u> that Paul is writing them in

Paul's <u>been very concerned</u> thru-out the Ltr about the Philippians maintaining <u>Unity & Peace</u> within the church

& now he's <u>closing the letter</u> with a <u>real life application</u> about <u>HOW</u> to actually maintain that <u>Unity</u> & <u>Peace</u> & I have NO DOUBT – that if any 2 people in the church would have <u>THIS SAME MIND</u> (that's described here) . . .

there would be <u>NO</u> Inter-Personal Conflicts in the Church

THAT is a very radical statement !!

<u>I know that if we would actually live out these Vs's</u> we would <u>see great victories</u> in the church over <u>the enemy's</u> <u>tried-&-true scheme</u> of bringing <u>division</u>

So – Let's go back & take it Vs-by-Vs

Phil 4:2-3

2 *I* implore Euodia and *I* implore Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord.

3 And I urge you also, <u>true companion</u>, help these women who labored with me in the gospel, with Clement also, and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the Book of Life.

The "*true companion*" Paul refers to here is basically unknown - altho many people have made "*educated guesses*"

We know it's a person Paul trusted to "<u>help</u>" these women the word "help" means <u>LIT</u> "<u>take hold of</u>" . . .

Paul says -

"True companion - take hold of these women - & help them"

Which is exactly what <u>Gal 6:1</u> says we are to do (read it later)

<u>These women</u> had labored w/ <u>Clement</u>, & the <u>fellow workers</u> - & their *"names are in the book of life"*

They were true Christians – active in the ministry

& beginning in <u>V.4</u> Paul is going to give them <u>crucial instruction</u> on how to keep <u>Unity</u> & <u>Peace</u> - in their hearts

His 1st command to fix this problem is – *Rejoice in the Lord always*

<u>Phil 4:4</u> 4 Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!

<u>Why</u> would Paul <u>begin his counsel</u> by saying Rejoice in the Lord always – & Again I say, rejoice ?

Because the truth is: Pretty much every dispute in the church comes from people focusing on <u>themselves</u>

<u>& so - one of the quickest ways to stop disputes</u>
is to get our focus <u>off ourselves</u>
& begin to <u>Rejoice in the Lord</u> <u>together</u>

If we would just <u>**put aside our disputes**</u>, & truly <u>begin rejoicing</u> in how good God is

- our minds would eventually be taken off our self-focus that got us worked up in the first place
- So the 1st command is Start <u>Rejoicing in the Lord always</u> (& cont.)

<u>the next command is in Phil 4:5</u> 5 Let your <u>gentleness</u> be known to all men. The Lord is at hand.

the word "*gentleness*" is LIT "*graciousness*" or "*forbearance*"

So – if in the midst of our Rejoicing in the Lord . . .

we would focus on letting our <u>Gentleness</u>, our <u>Graciousness</u>, & our <u>Forbearance</u> (*patience*) be <u>known to all men</u> . . .

THEN – how would we be doing in the **UNITY** department ??

<u>The problem is</u> – these traits "<u>Gentleness</u>" – "<u>Graciousness</u>" – "<u>Forbearance</u>"

These traits <u>don't come</u> from our <u>SELF</u> these <u>are fruits</u> of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>

& if we will <u>crucify</u> our <u>SELF nature</u> & actually <u>walk</u> in the <u>Spirit</u> in our relationships in the church

Then our relationships can be directed by the Holy Spirit . . .

<u>instead of conflict & division – people would see</u> <u>L</u>ove – <u>J</u>oy – <u>P</u>eace – <u>L</u>ongsuffering – <u>K</u>indness – <u>G</u>oodness -<u>F</u>aithfulness – <u>G</u>entleness – <u>S</u>elf <u>C</u>ontrol (<u>Gal 5:22</u>)

All we have to do is;

- 1) Crucify our flesh
- 2) Truly give control of our lives to the Holy Spirit
- 3) be **<u>Transformed</u>** by the renewing of our minds
- 4) **<u>Repeat</u>** that process every single day

& we **<u>CAN</u>** do this! – *The Holy Spirit within us is our power*

Then Paul ends V.5 with the encouragement 'The Lord is at hand"

Jesus **is coming back** – He really is

Do you really want to be bickering over some minor issue when Jesus shows up? - - I don't think so

Instead let's be found Rejoicing in the Lord & Walking in the Spirit

- & now <u>in V.6</u> we come to the famous vs's of this text which definitely apply to ALL stressful situations in life
- & I encourage you to use them in every stressful situation in life

But <u>look at the power</u> of these Vs's In <u>the context of</u> <u>stress</u> in the <u>church</u> – in the <u>ministry</u> – between <u>saints</u>

Look at the power of these Vs's in THAT context

<u>Phil 4:6</u>

6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;

- The word <u>anxious</u> actually comes from the same word we get the word "<u>Strangle</u>" from . . .
- Have you ever been "strangled" by anxiety & worry ??
- The word also conveys a picture of obsessively analyzing the minutest details about a thing *going over & over it*
- & finally it has the sense of "*being incapacitated*" by worry
- We just get <u>SOOO</u> worked up when we disagree with someone that we just get "beside ourselves"
- well here in <u>V.6</u> The Holy Spirit actually <u>issues us a Command</u>

<u>BE ANXIOUS FOR NOTHING</u> – <u>LIT</u> "for not one thing" (a command)

- **DON'T** do that **INSTEAD** there's a process here by which we can truly turn things over to God
- & by which we can <u>truly be freed</u> from <u>incapacitating anxiety</u> of <u>things</u> – or <u>circumstances</u> – or of <u>people</u>

The process starts in V.6

6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by <u>prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u>, with <u>thanksgiving</u>, let your requests be made known to God;

The Holy Spirit lists Three Ways in which to <u>let your requests</u> be <u>made known</u> to God

& each of these words is a step toward the healing of anxiety

1st – let your requests be made known IN PRAYER

This word for "*prayer*" speaks of addressing God in **worship**, **adoration**, and **devotion**

Whenever we find ourselves worrying - our first action ought to be to get alone with God and worship Him

We've got to realize the <u>greatness</u> and <u>majesty</u> of God We've got to realize He is <u>big enough</u> to solve our problems

The first step in "no worry praying" is *adoration* Spend time telling God how great, & powerful, & loving He is

2nd – let your requests be made known IN SUPPLICATION

Supplication is not just reading off your list to God -

Supplication suggests intensity & earnestness in extended prayer to fully transfer your burden into God's hands

Supplication is an impassioned release of your burdens to God

<u>3rd – let your requests be made known WITH THANKSGIVING</u>

Thanksgiving is really an attitude of heart – <u>AND</u> it's the <u>miracle step</u> to overcoming worry & anxiety

<u>I promise</u> you – if you will begin to <u>Characterize your life</u> by being <u>constantly Thankful to God</u> for all He's done for you

I promise you - - <u>anxiety</u> - <u>worry</u> - & <u>conflict</u> will begin to <u>lose their grip</u>

There is *healing*, *refreshing*, *renewal* in **true thanksgiving**

& if we will get caught up in *thanking God* for being at work *in THAT* very situation that's making us so anxious

Believe me – it will begin to change how we view our circumstances & our trials

& then – look at God's promise - if we'll actually do this

If we'll actually go thru the 3 steps listed in V.6 – here's the promise

Phil 4:7

7 and the peace <u>of</u> God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

You <u>turn that situation</u> over to God thru <u>Prayer</u> – thru <u>Supplication</u> - & thru <u>Thanksgiving</u>

& the promise is - *the Peace <u>OF</u> God which surpasses ALL understanding* – will guard your <u>hearts</u> & <u>minds</u> thru Christ Jesus

This is the Peace OF God

<u>Rom 5:1</u> says – when you put your faith in Jesus Christ you immediately have Peace <u>*WITH*</u> God

But God doesn't stop there He says not only can we have Peace <u>WITH</u> God . . .

But because of the Holy Spirit living in us we can actually have the Peace <u>OF GOD</u> in our lives

The best definition I found of the "Peace of God";

"a quiet confidence, or tranquility in God, regardless of circumstances"

The peace <u>**OF</u>** God allows you to go thru circumstances in this life w/ a quiet confidence & tranquility . . .</u>

Knowing that the God of the universe is aware & He's at work for your good So you can be at PEACE

(re: Peace of God) Isa 26:3 - Col 3:15

& then V.7 says - this miraculous <u>Peace OF God</u> will <u>GUARD</u> our hearts & minds thru Christ Jesus

"<u>*Guard*</u>" is a military word - pictures a soldier standing guard or a garrison of soldiers guarding a certain thing

& that's what the Peace OF God will do for your heart & mind

Because your Victory over anxiety is determined to a large extent on the condition of your <u>heart</u> & <u>mind</u>

& God wants to <u>Guard your Heart & Mind</u> with His <u>Peace</u>

Guys – <u>the mind</u> is a very powerful thing -& we should protect it like a <u>top secret weapon</u>

Because if your enemy can get you to set your mind on the things that will <u>damage your walk</u> . . . then he's got you on a *pretty easy road* to destruction

& so – <u>in V.8</u> – Paul gives us ONE MORE critical counsel On walking in <u>UNITY</u> - & the <u>PEACE OF GOD</u>

<u>Phil 4:8</u>

8 Finally, brethren, whatever things are <u>true</u>, whatever things are <u>noble</u>, whatever things are <u>just</u>, whatever things are <u>pure</u>, whatever things are <u>lovely</u>, whatever things are of <u>good report</u>, if there is any <u>virtue</u> and if there is <u>anything praiseworthy</u>—meditate on these things.

The GK word for "<u>Meditate</u>" means <u>concentrated</u>, <u>focused</u> effort It's also translated "<u>THINK</u>"

- So Paul says Put concentrated focused mental effort ONLY upon things that are GOOD
- which means DO NOT put that kind of mental effort into things that are NOT GOOD
- Let's just agree on one thing here What our mind dwells on – EFFECTS US
- It's been proven 100 times over & 100 times again We BECOME what our mind dwells on
- & God knows how we're made cause HE made us
- & so God says "*meditate on whatever is GOOD*" because He knows we will become what we focus on
- We could easily go on ½ dozen tangents right now but let's not
- The context here is actually <u>UNITY</u> among church members so <u>let's apply this principal</u> to that context

So often someone says or does something that really is minor compared to the eternally important things

But we take that little offense - & we roll it over & over again in our minds until we are SO anxious & worked up about it

that it can easily damage our walk with the Lord – or worse

But if we would simply apply these principals – those minor things would never consume us

If we would Each;

- (**v.4**) *<u>Rejoice</u>* in the Lord always
- (**v.5**) Let our *gentleness* be known to all
- (**v.6**) Be <u>anxious for nothing</u>, but in everything – by <u>Prayer</u>, <u>Supplication</u>, & <u>Thanksgiving</u> let our requests be made known to God
- (v.7) Let the *Peace of God* guard our hearts & minds thru Christ
- (v.8) And if we would <u>Meditate ONLY on things that are;</u> <u>True</u> - <u>Noble</u> – <u>Just</u> – <u>Pure</u> – <u>Lovely</u> – of <u>Good Report</u> -<u>Virtuous</u> - & <u>Praise Worthy</u>

If we would TRULY apply these scriptures to our daily lives

How much better would things be – for us personally - & for the church

Finally – Paul closes this great text w/ a Vs we really need to understand

Phil 4:9 \rightarrow \rightarrow

<u>Phil 4:9</u>

9 The things which you <u>learned and received</u> and <u>heard and saw</u> in me, <u>these do</u>, and the God of peace will be with you.

the things you **<u>learned & received</u>** from me the things you **<u>heard & saw</u>** in me

THESE DO - & the God of peace will be with you

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- (**v.4**) <u>*Rejoice*</u> in the Lord always
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- (v.7) & the <u>Peace of God</u> will guard your hearts & minds thru Christ
- (v.8) And Focus your mind ONLY on these things; Whatever is <u>True</u> - <u>Noble</u> – <u>Just</u> – <u>Pure</u> – <u>Lovely</u> – of <u>Good Report</u> - <u>Virtuous</u> - & <u>Praise Worthy</u>

& the God of Peace – Will be with you !
