Gal 07 – The Purpose of the Law – Gal 3:19-29

After all Paul's written so far – we could **easily imagine** the Judaizers coming to the defense of the law

We could almost <u>hear them say</u> "If Righteousness comes thru faith alone – If God's promise to Abraham is really fulfilled in Christ . . . then what is the purpose of the law?"

Well - Paul was FAR from declaring the law was unnecessary -

The Law has a <u>specific & a **critical function**</u> - in our coming to salvation . . . & I pray you'll see that today

maybe <u>you've wondered</u> the same thing – What exactly is the Law for, & more importantly, how exactly does it apply to our lives today ??

Let's Pray

Paul starts this morning w/ the question maybe some of us have today . . .

Gal 3:19

19 What purpose then does the law serve? . . .

Fair ques. - & maybe <u>one you've asked</u> yourself . . . maybe you've wondered HOW does the law fit into our relationship w/ the Lord

If you've asked yourself that question – I promise you this text will answer it

Gal 3:19

19 What purpose then does the law serve? It was added because of transgressions, . . .

The law was added **Because of sin** – more literally – *to Define sin* –

The Law was given **to show man** the depth of his sin - & to show man his *total inability* to become righteous on his own

The law came to prove **the extent of man's s**in – in order to point to the One who would deal, once & for all, with the sin that we could never erase

Gal 3:19

19 What purpose then does the law serve? It was added because of transgressions, till the Seed should come to whom the promise was made; . . .

- The law was given to **prove our sinfulness** to us & to cause us to look to the One to whom the promise was made Jesus Christ
- Guys if you will understand the law I promise you . . . you will understand your need for a Savior cause that's what the law does
- cause If we **don't understand** the reality, of God's Required Judgment on sin Then we will NOT see **our need** for a Savior . . .

Haven't you met people that say . . . "Hey, don't give me that Jesus Saves stuff – I'm a pretty good person – I think God's pretty happy with the way I live"

- **THAT** is a person who **Does Not** understand God's Law & because he doesn't understand God's law he doesn't understand his need for a Savior
- When we understand God's Full Requirement to <u>judge any & all sin</u> . . . & <u>when we understand</u> that our lives are riddled w/ that sin <u>THEN</u> we understand how desperately we need a Savior
- The purpose of the law is to prove how **totally & completely Lost** we are, before a perfectly Holy & Righteous God . . .

& to convince us of our need for *the Saving Grace* found only in Jesus Christ

Now – the last part of **Gal 3:19, & v.20** – is an incredibly **powerful statement** - But it's one that can be missed - if we're not real careful

Gal 3:19D-20

- ... and it [the law] was appointed through angels by the hand of a mediator.

 20 Now a mediator does not mediate for one only, but God is one.
- <u>Let's start</u> w/ the end of <u>V.19</u> the law was appointed thru angels – by the hand of a mediator . . .
- So we know **the mediator** of the law was *Moses*, & in at least 4 places in the Bible - Angels are mentioned in connection w/ the giving of the law
- But here is Paul's probable Point The law <u>required a Mediator</u> (Moses), because there were two parties w/ obligation (God & Us),
- in the law, <u>our obligation</u> was to follow the Entirety of the law . . . & <u>God's obligation</u> was to either bring wrath if we DID NOT follow the Entirety of the law or . . .
- to theoretically **bring Righteousness** should we happen to be able to perfectly follow every point of the law which *(of course)* never happened
- So because there were <u>two parties w/ obligations</u> Moses was made the mediator between the parties
- But what happens if there is only **ONE PARTY** in a Covenant ?? Is there a need for a mediator if there's only One Party in a covenant?
- & that is the question that <u>V.20 answers</u> 20 <u>Now a mediator does not mediate for one only, but God is one.</u>
- When the <u>Promise of Righteousness</u> thru Faith was Given to Abraham God put Abraham <u>TO SLEEP</u> knocked him out cold . . . WHY?
- because Abraham <u>did not have an obligation</u> in the covenant Abraham *had* believed God, and it was accounted to him as righteousness
- The promise & the covenant were <u>ALL of GOD</u> –

 It was all of God's Doing it was all of God's Guarantee –

 It was done in the <u>eternal</u> <u>unchangeableness</u> of God alone

& Abraham simply <u>received the promise</u> that came <u>BY</u> God's grace - & <u>THRU</u> Abrahams Faith - the exact same way we receive God's promise

Mal 3:6 (Rich Z.)

6 "For I am the LORD, I do not change; . . .

Cont'g in V.21 – Paul asks the ques. he knows is on his reader's mind . . .

Gal 3:21A

21 Is the law then against [contrary to] the promises of God? <u>Certainly not!</u>

- "May it Never Be!" the Law & the Promise are both from God God never changes - & He certainly would never contradict Himself
- The law is not "<u>set against</u>" or "<u>contrary to</u>" the Promise they <u>are both part</u> of <u>God's **Single plan** of salvation</u> for all who believe . . .

Which is exactly what Paul is referring to in 2nd half of V.21

Gal 3:21B

... For if there had been a law given which could have given life, truly righteousness would have been by the law.

God could never say:

"Well the law didn't work – so I'll have to come up with something else"

- Paul's saying here the law was <u>Never Intended to Work</u> It was <u>never God's plan</u> to make man righteous thru the law
- So when we see people trying to <u>make themselves</u> "Righteous" by following their own list of <u>selected parts</u> of God's law . . .
- It proves they have certainly <u>never understood</u> the purpose of the Law again the 2nd half of <u>Gal 3:21</u> says . . . [<u>REPEAT GAL 3:21B</u>]

Now - in **V.22** . . .

Now - in **V.22** - Paul **continues proving** what the purpose of the law is

Gal 3:22A

22 But the Scripture has confined all under sin, . . .

- Paul's simply restating the <u>purpose of the Law</u> & he says; "the Law confines us all under sin"
- This word "<u>Confined</u>" means <u>LIT</u>: "<u>to enclose on all sides</u>" the picture is of <u>fish caught in a net</u> enclosed on all sides . . .
- **THAT** is what the law is supposed to do to <u>enclose us</u> on all sides under sin To leave us <u>NO WAY OUT</u> from under the condemnation of our sin
- & that is what **proves to us** the only way out is to take God's **great promise** of Amazing Grace thru faith in Jesus Christ . . .
- When the law '<u>Confines'</u> us under sin it makes us <u>ready</u> to receive the promise that comes in Jesus Christ

Let's read all of Gal 3:22

22 But the Scripture has confined all under sin, that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.

The law condemns us in our sin - **so we'll see** our need for a Savior, & **so we'll receive** the Promise by faith in Jesus Christ

& that's what Paul was referring to in Rom 7:24-25 when he writes . . .

Rom 7:24

24 O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?

then he says in **V.25** – w/ ea of us who **understand our "lostness"** in sin . . .

Rom 7:25 (NLT)

25 Thank God! The answer is in Jesus Christ our Lord . . .

- Paul's doing a great job of **explaining the purpose** of the law But he's not finished proving his point yet . . .
- In <u>v.23</u> he gives <u>another example</u> of how the Law <u>prepared us</u> for Christ

23 But before faith came, we were <u>kept under guard</u> by the law, <u>kept</u> for the faith which would afterward be revealed.

The word "<u>kept under guard</u>" is the picture of a <u>guarded **prison cell** – . . . the Law was **our Guard** – that kept us imprisoned by our sin</u>

Paul says in Rom 7:7;

- . . . I would not have known sin except through the law . . .
- The purpose of he law is to hold us "<u>under the conviction</u>" of sin Like a guard reminding us we can't be Righteous on our own . . .
- Then we see again this word "*KEPT for the faith*" here in v.23 Same Greek word as translated in v.22 as "*Confined*"
- Again this word means "<u>to enclose on all sides</u>" The law encloses us on all sides . . . WHY? . . .
- it says here in v.23 . . . "for the faith which would afterward be revealed"
- Guys <u>Forgiveness</u> by God's Grace means nothing to a person who doesn't <u>know</u> they need to be forgiven . . .

 That's what's meant by "the law <u>confines us</u> for the faith"
- If I walked up to you "<u>out-of-the-blue</u>" <u>& told you</u> there's someone willing to die in your place for the crimes you've committed that deserve death you'd look at me like I was crazy, & walk away
- But <u>If</u> you were on <u>Death Row</u> 24 hrs away from being executed & I walked up to you & told you there was someone willing to die in your place for the crimes you've committed that deserve death . . .

- you'd be very anxious to hear all about it & **you'd be amazed** that an innocent man would be willing to die in your place . . .
- **THAT** is the Purpose of the Law to **make you amazed** that the very Son of God would take your place & pay the death penalty for you
- The law proves to us that we are <u>on death row</u> & there's no way we can EARN our way out of the penalty . . .
- So when the offer of Salvation <u>BY</u> God's Grace <u>THRU</u> Faith Alone comes . . The fact that the law has shown us we are On Death Row makes us ready to Receive Salvation Thru Faith in Christ

& so now – we come to "yet another" **Famous vs.** in Galatians . . .

Gal 3:24

24 Therefore the law was our <u>tutor</u> to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith.

I trust the <u>purpose of the law</u> is becoming more & more clear -But this vs should absolutely <u>Seal It !</u>

Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ – that's pretty clear!

The Greek word for "Tutor" is paidagogos - & KJV translates - Schoolmaster

But actually a *paidagogos* was generally the most trustworthy slave in a well to do Greek, or Roman, family . . .

& he was most often charged - w/ supervising the life of the "Heir" of the family

- The <u>paidagogos</u> took charge of <u>the heir's</u> day-to-day activities they instructed the heir in school lessons & in obedience & they had the authority to administer discipline . . .
- So <u>the heir</u> would grow to both <u>love & respect</u> their <u>paidagogos</u> (tutor) HOWEVER the role of the <u>paidagogos</u> was never permanent

- As the heir grew up he'd **begin to look forward** to that day of manhood, when he was no longer ruled by his *paidagogos* . . .
- but instead he would now be ruled <u>in his freedom</u> by all of the training his <u>paidagogos</u> had given him

& that's Exactly what **Gal 3:24** says – the Law did for us;

24 Therefore the law was our [paidagogos] tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith.

- The Law <u>KEPT</u> <u>GUARDED</u> & <u>TRAINED</u> the "Heirs" so we could one day be governed by Christ living in us
- BUT after the Heir reaches maturity & <u>he is released</u> from his <u>paidagogos</u>, He never has to go back under that tutor the tutor has done it's job
- & after the law leads a man to Christ that man <u>never has to go back</u> under the authority of the <u>tutor</u> of the law the tutor has done it's job & now <u>Christ living in us</u> can take over

& that's exactly what **Gal 3:25** tells us . . .

Gal 3:25

25 But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.

- Faith in Christ <u>is the freedom</u> the Heir was longing for that day when his tutor had finished his job . . . & now the Heir could live in response to all his training
- & it's <u>not that</u> the Tutor is <u>no longer</u> relevant it's that The Purpose of the tutor has been accomplished Fulfilled
- & so for us *Living in Christ* is **the Fulfillment** of the Law
- & not only does <u>Living in Christ</u> fulfill the law in us but it also makes us **true Heirs** of God . . .

Gal 3:26 . . . →

26 For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus.

All those who have come to God thru Faith in Christ Jesus – are <u>Heirs of God</u> No longer under the "Guarding" or "Tutoring" of the Law . . .

But we have come into full **Son-ship** (Daughter-ship) w/ God as we'll read later in **Gal 4:6-7** . . .

Gal 4:6-7

6 And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father!"

7 Therefore you are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

Thru Christ we are **no longer under** the "Tutoring" of the law – But we have now arrived – as full Heirs of God . . .

& How exactly does this happen - that we become "Heirs" of God . . . ??

It happens by our identification **IN CHRIST** . . .

Gal 3:27

27 For as many of you as were **baptized** into Christ have put on Christ.

Someone pls tell me the Greek word for "Baptized" here (baptizo)

- Now we know Paul is **NOT** talking about the act of being <u>dunked in water</u>
 Because the **WHOLE** point of the book of Galatians is
 Righteousness thru **FAITH ALONE w/ nothing added!**
- So Paul's **NOT** speaking of **the physical act** of baptism (Bapto) He's speaking of the literal (spiritual) meaning of **Baptizo**

<u>Baptizo</u> means to be so identified - as to bring upon <u>a permanent change</u>

The picture of this word is – A Cucumber becoming <u>A Pickle</u>

Read Rom 6:3-5 to understand this great truth . . .

- Paul's saying those who've been **So Identified** with Christ Who've been so immersed in Christ have actually "Put On" Christ!
- The words ""put on Christ" mean Divinely Clothed with Christ . . .
- & that "Being Clothed" with Christ has made you an **Heir of God**; no longer a **Slave** to the Law but an **Heir** of God & **Joint Heir** w/ Christ
- & actually, this truth that we are "<u>Clothed in Christ</u>" is at the very heart of all of Christianity it's what makes it all work
- & not only does this truth *(clothed w/ Christ)* make us **One w/ Christ** but it also makes us One with **EVERY OTHER** Believer

28 There is neither <u>Jew nor Greek</u>, there is neither <u>slave nor free</u>, there is neither <u>male</u> <u>nor female</u>; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

- When we are <u>truly clothed</u> with Christ <u>not only do we</u> become one w/ Christ But we also become <u>one w/</u> every other believer . . .
- It's interesting Paul would use this series of comparisons NEITHER <u>Jew</u> nor <u>Greek</u>, <u>Slave</u> nor <u>Free</u>, <u>Male</u> nor <u>Female</u> . . .
- There was a Traditional **Jewish prayer** the men prayed every day . . .
- & it said "I thank you God, that I was not born a <u>Gentile</u>, a <u>Slave</u>, or a <u>Woman</u>" & Paul is probably referring to that very prayer here –
- & he abolishes it in Christ . . . & says "for you are all one in Christ Jesus"
- Finally Paul <u>closes this section</u> by going back to Father Abraham which is the same way he started it back in <u>V.6</u>

Gal 3:29 . . . →

29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

Because of everything we've <u>studying</u> in the last three weeks – Because of everything Paul's <u>written</u> in this powerful Chapter Because of <u>all those things</u> . . . Paul says;

If you are Christ's (belong to Him THRU Faith) then you are Abraham's seed – and most importantly – you are heirs according to the promise . . .

BY God's Grace - & **THRU** Faith alone . . . You & I become **Heirs** to the very promise God made to Abraham . . .

& So - the vital purpose of the Law . . . was to lead us to the promise In Christ so that "in Christ" we could be *Heirs according to that Promise*
