# Gal 14 - The Battle of Spirit v. Flesh, PT 2 - Gal 5:19-25

- This is <u>Pt-2</u> of a msg we <u>started lst wk</u> If you weren't here pls get that msg because <u>it's the ground work</u> for this msg (why)
- I'd also really <u>encourage you</u> to get the msg "<u>Spirit or flesh</u>" from <u>WBM</u> because it goes into <u>HOW</u> to <u>Walk in the Spirit</u> (3-step recipe)
- <u>Today we look at the **Litmus test**</u> that easily proves whether our actions are coming from <u>the Flesh</u> or From <u>the Spirit</u>
- Websters defines "Litmus Test"; a test where a single fact is decisive
- & that's what these lists do If we will apply them to our lives - they are "<u>Decisive Proof</u>" of whether we are "<u>In the Flesh</u>" or "<u>In the Spirit</u>"
- Paul is going to show us today side-by-side what

  Walking in the Flesh looks like vs. what 
  Walking in the Spirit looks like

<u>it's important for us to understand – Neither of these lists is Exhaustive –</u>
We find other lists on this subject in **Eph 4** & **Col 3** (& other places)

## **Gal 5:19(A)**

19 Now the works of the flesh are evident,

- The "Works of the Flesh" is what the Flesh produces in our lives including (& especially) the Christian's life (Paul's writing to Christians)
- & we defined "The Flesh" as the sin nature we still drag around as Christians the nature that's supposed to be AT WAR with the New Nature

& to be "In the Flesh" doesn't take an "Active Choice" (like Walking in the Spirit) because by our "nature" the flesh just comes out on it's own

I think **that's why** Paul says the works of the flesh are "*Evident*" . . .

# Gal 5:19-21(A)

19 Now the works of the flesh are <u>evident</u>, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness,

20 idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies,

21 envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; . . .

Paul seems to break the <u>Works of the Flesh</u> down into basically <u>3 Categories</u>: <u>Sexual</u> / <u>Religious</u> / <u>Relational</u> . . . 1<sup>st</sup> is Sexual

#### **SEXUAL:**

Adultery = just what we think it is

<u>Fornication</u> = from Gk "porneia" where we get our "pornography" –

Lit: all sexual acts outside of marriage

<u>Uncleanness</u> = lustful or impure living

**Lewdness** = unrestrained sexual indulgence

Paul starts out with the "Familiar" works of the Flesh -

The <u>sexual</u> areas of <u>The Flesh</u> are the easy ones – & the ones Christians love to point at - & condemn people for . . .

<u>unfortunately</u> – the <u>Sexual</u> areas of <u>the Flesh</u> – are in the <u>same list</u> as <u>Jealousy</u> - <u>Selfish Ambition</u> - & <u>Dissention</u> - (important to remember)

Next - Paul goes to the Religious Works of the Flesh (only 2);

#### **RELIGIOUS**;

<u>Idolatry</u> = Worshipping anything over God (esp. anything man-made)

**Sorcery** = Gk – "<u>pharmakeia</u>" – where we get "pharmaceutical" – the word became a Synonym for occult practices because of the heavy reliance on drugs

So – **Idolatry & Sorcery** – are the **Religious** *Works of the Flesh* 

& now - we get to the **Relational** Works of the flesh . . .

Interesting Paul lists <u>4 Sexual</u> Works of the Flesh – & only <u>2 Religious</u> – but he lists <u>11 Relational</u> <u>Works of the Flesh</u> . . . & then he ends it by saying . . . and the like

### **RELATIONAL**;

- 1) Hatred strong feelings of <u>malice</u> toward another person (<u>malice</u> = "a desire to see pain or distress in another)
- 2) Contentions discord or quarrels
- 3) Jealousy distrust or suspicion of another person
- 4) Outbursts of wrath actions brought about by anger
- 5) Selfish ambitions self-centered interest at another's expense
- 6) Dissentions separations caused by disagreements
- <u>7) Heresies</u> (Gk either Religious or Relational) *in a 'Relational sense'* = dissension arising from diversity of opinions (KJV = <u>factions</u>)
- 8) Envy jealousy of another's prosperity
- 9) Murders certainly a work of the Flesh (or worse)
- 10) Drunkenness just what we think . . .
- 11) Revelries rowdy, rude behavior "the consequence of drunkenness"

Now (for me) a portion of this list has **special application** to "The Church" the MORE we consider ourselves "In The Church" – the LESS we think - we may be operating "In the Flesh"

But Remember - Paul is writing to Christians "In the Church"

- So I want to look at just <u>6 of these 11</u> "Works of the Flesh" . . . w/ <u>special thought</u> toward our <u>actions</u> in the church
- 1) Hatred strong feelings of malice toward another person
- <u>2) Contentions</u> discord or quarrels
- 3) Jealousy distrust or suspicion of another person
- 4) Outbursts of wrath actions brought about by anger
- 5) Selfish ambitions self-centered interest at another's expense
- 6) Dissentions separations caused by disagreements

if WE have . .[definition] . . WE are <u>acting in the Flesh</u> if WE are in a . .[definition] . WE are <u>acting in the Flesh</u> if WE have . . .

- <u>Guys We **need to be honest** with ourselves about these actions because these are the actions</u> that <u>Destroy Churches Every Day</u> as Christians **play right into** the *Enemy's hand* day after day . . .
- But If Jesus Christ truly has Rule & Reign in our life

  IF we are being Led by the Spirit –
  then we should be AT WAR with these Works of the Flesh
- that <u>doesn't mean</u> we <u>won't ever stumble</u> in these areas but <u>when we do</u> The Holy Spirit will <u>convict</u> us & we must <u>repent of it</u>
- <u>If Christians</u> in the Church would <u>force themselves</u> to be <u>Honest</u> about <u>these actions</u> being the <u>Works of the Flesh</u> in their lives . . .
- Then <u>the enemy</u> <u>would have to resort</u> to other <u>tactics</u> (schemes) to <u>continue</u> to try to <u>destroy</u> the <u>church</u>

Now – that's a <u>heavy message</u> to <u>the Church</u> – but it's about to <u>get heavier</u> We're about to read a <u>very serious Warning</u> about these <u>Works of the Flesh</u>

- Gal 5:21(B) after finishing the list of the Works of the Flesh . . .
- 21(b)... of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who **practice** such things <u>will not</u> inherit the kingdom of God.
- Now <u>THAT</u> is a serious Warning & this is <u>not the only place</u> we see it; <u>1Jn Ch 3</u> – <u>1Cor Ch 6</u> – <u>Eph Ch 5</u> – all have <u>similar warnings</u>
- But to <u>understand</u> this <u>Warning</u> we <u>Must</u> <u>understand</u> the <u>Greek Language</u>
- The Greek Verb here for the word "PRACTICE" is prasso;

  Tense & Voice = Present & Active = a continual habitual action –

  Verb mood = the Gk Participle = like adding "ing" to English word
- So in the Greek this Vs. would say;
  Those who are **Continually**, **Habitually Practicing** these things **will not** inherit the Kingdom of Heaven
- Now <u>Is that a picture</u> of a Christian who <u>loses</u> their Salvation for <u>Continually Practicing</u> these things . . . <u>I don't think so</u>
- It is a <u>picture</u> of someone who has <u>NOT</u> truly made <u>Jesus Christ their Lord</u> a <u>picture</u> of someone who has <u>NOT</u> truly been <u>Born-Again</u>
- What the Bible is saying in these Warnings is;

  IF you have truly made Jesus Christ your Lord –
  you will NOT BE Continually, Habitually, Practicing these things
- These warnings are a <u>Salvation</u> "wake-up call" to those who think they can be habitually "Walking in the Flesh" & <u>still say</u> Jesus is their Lord
- Now this doesn't mean a Christian won't fall into the Flesh We do

  But when we do the Holy Spirit convicts us

  & causes us to be repentant & remorseful for stumbling

The **Gk word** used for the **Occasional Occurrence** of these practices; would be "**poieo**" – & it would **not have** the "**Verb Aspects**" of **Continual & Habitual action** 

So - That makes this list of the "Works of the Flesh" - quite a Litmus test

Now – I don't mean to be too direct here; but - - if we are

Continually, Habitually Practicing these things - - there's a chance we need (today) to Truly make Jesus Christ the Lord of our lives

**<u>& Praise God</u>** – if just **1 person** today realizes that !!!

**<u>Let's move on</u>** to the Contrast of the *Fruit of the Spirit* 

In Contrast to the "Works of the Flesh"

What would be the Continual Habitual Practice of a Christian who is Walking in the Spirit?

# Gal 5:22-23(A)

22 But the <u>fruit</u> of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

23 gentleness, self-control . . . .

Notice - these actions are <u>Fruits</u> – <u>NOT</u> <u>Works</u>

The <u>Works of the Flesh</u> are actions <u>we produce ourselves</u> – The <u>Fruit of the Spirit</u> are actions <u>we CANNOT produce</u> ourselves

These actions are **produced one way** - & <u>one way only</u> – . . . <u>described by Jesus</u> Himself in **Jn 15:4-5** . . .

### Jn 15:4-5

4 Abide in Me, and I in you. <u>As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself</u>, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me.

- 5 "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who <u>abides in Me</u>, <u>and I in him</u>, <u>bears</u> much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.
- <u>Jesus makes it clear we **CANNOT** produce the **Fruit of the Spirit** All we can do is **Abide in Him** & **He produces** it thru us</u>
- Over **70 times** in the NT the **Fruit of the Believer** is addressed maybe that's why **Religion** is so prone to "<u>Works Based</u>" Salvation . . . sometimes we **like to say** our "<u>Works</u>" are really "<u>Fruit</u>"

### <u>The difference – is Relationship . . .;</u>

We can <u>ACT</u> Religious - <u>w/o having</u> a relationship w/ Christ But we <u>CANNOT</u> produce the <u>Fruit of the Spirit</u> w/o that <u>continual abiding relationship</u> w/ Jesus Christ

So – Let's go back to **Gal 5:22** - & look at the *Fruit of the Holy Spirit* 

# **Gal 5:22-23(A)**

22 But the <u>fruit</u> of the Spirit is <u>love</u>, <u>joy</u>, <u>peace</u>, <u>longsuffering</u>, <u>kindness</u>, <u>goodness</u>, <u>faithfulness</u>,

23 gentleness, self-control . . . .

IF we are Abiding in Christ as our Lord & Savior . . .

& **IF** we are *Walking in the Spirit* (discussed last wk) – then **THIS** is the *fruit* that will be **coming thru** our lives

& it will come *more* & *more* as we **grow** in our Relationship w/ Christ . . .

as we are transformed more & more into His image -

As we "<u>Behold</u>" <u>His Glory</u> (as in a mirror) <u>2Cor 3:18</u> says – then we'll be transformed from <u>Glory to Glory</u> – <u>BY</u> the <u>Spirit of the Lord</u>

& IF this fruit is **NOT** in your life – you can begin to have it **today** – all you have to do is **CHOOSE** to *Abide more in Christ* – & **CHOOSE** to *Walk more in the Spirit (thought-by-thought)* 

Let's go thru the Fruit one at a time;

- 1) Love The Supreme Fruit of Christ living in us the Gk word = Agape
- Some <u>scholars feel</u> this is actually the <u>all-encompassing</u> <u>Fruit of the Spirit</u> & <u>the rest</u> is the fruit that <u>flows out</u> of <u>True Agape Love</u>
- Jesus said in Mat 22 there are TWO "all encompassing" commandments
- <u>Love</u> the Lord your God & <u>Love</u> your Neighbor & both times Jesus uses the <u>Verb form</u> of <u>Agape</u> (agapao)
- & Rom 5:5 says the ONLY way we can have this kind of love is to have it poured out into our hearts BY the Holy Spirit
- Agape Love is the ALL-Unconditional / ALL-Sacrificial Love of God
- & <u>in that way</u> <u>Agape love</u> <u>does encompass</u> all the other Fruit (but we're going to <u>go thru the List</u> anyway)
- <u>2) Joy</u> nothing to do with circumstances not a human emotion -A <u>deep-down sense of well being</u> that all is Right between you God – it often comes in the midst of the worst circumstances
- <u>3) Peace</u> also <u>NOT</u> related to circumstances A <u>Tranquility of Mind</u> that comes from knowing God is in control of all aspects of a believer's life & knowing He is always at Work for our Ultimate Good
- 4) Longsuffering (Patience) LIT: the tolerance to endure injuries inflicted by others, and the calm willingness to accept irritating or painful situations
- <u>5) Kindness</u> a tender concern for others a genuine desire to treat others 'gently'

- 6) Goodness a moral & spiritual excellence evidenced by active kindness
- 7) Faithfulness loyalty & trustworthiness
- 8) Gentleness often translated "Meekness" a humble and gentle attitude that is patiently submissive in every offense, while being free of any desire for revenge or retribution
- 9) Self-Control LIT: to master fleshly desires and passions
- <u>WOW</u> that's quite a list and <u>hopefully</u> we all feel '<u>convicted'</u> a bit (I do) because this Fruit should <u>always be growing</u> more & more in us
- This list is <u>not meant</u> to make us "<u>Give Up</u>" but <u>instead</u> to make us "<u>Cling to Christ</u>" all the more
- As we Abide more & more in Christ the outcome will be; the *Fruit of the Spirit* will increase more & more in our lives . . .

What a great thing to look forward to - in our Life w/ Christ

## 2Pet 1:5-8

- 5 But also for this very reason [that we are partakers of the Divine nature <u>v.4</u>], giving all diligence, <u>add</u> to your faith virtue, [add] to virtue knowledge,
- 6 [add] to knowledge self-control, [add] to self-control perseverance, [add] to perseverance godliness,
- $7~[add] \ to \ godliness \ brotherly \ kindness, \ and \ [add] \ to \ brotherly \ kindness \ love.$
- 8 For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- I love the word **ADD** (Written once then implied) because it means there's **HOPE** - AS I continue to Abide in Christ . . . **HE** will be **Adding** these things to my life!!
- My point is <u>IF</u> we are <u>Abiding</u> in Jesus Christ we will <u>always</u> be <u>growing this Fruit</u>...

So – <u>take Hope</u> – the <u>Fruit of the Spirit</u> will be more & more evident in our lives the more & more we <u>Abide in Christ</u> (the more we <u>KNOW</u> Him)

### the Fruit of the Spirit is the Supernatural Outcome

of **Abiding in Jesus** – of always seeking to **Know Him more** - of being **Desperately Dependent** on Him

& that's the **great confidence** we have – in living the Christian life

& so back in **Gal Ch 5** – at the end of **V.23** we read;

# **Gal 5:23(B)**

v.23(B)... Against such there is no law.

simply meaning there is **NO LAW** written against such Godly actions –

### & let's finish today – starting in **Gal 5:24**

24 And those who are Christ's have <u>crucified</u> the flesh with its passions and desires.

a **POSITIONAL** Statement – meant to *give us confidence* in the battle

## In Rom 6:6 - Paul says;

6 knowing this, that our <u>old man</u> was <u>crucified with Him</u>, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should <u>no longer be slaves of sin</u>.

If you belong to Christ today – He has <u>Positionally Crucified</u> your <u>Old</u> (sin) <u>Nature</u> – It <u>no longer has Power</u> over you –

You are **no longer** are a slave to your <u>Sin Nature</u> – You are **no longer** a slave to <u>your Flesh</u>

Because of Jesus Christ – you <u>no longer are in bondage</u> to live by the <u>Works of the Flesh</u>

## So - in Gal 5:24 - When Paul says;

24 And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

It means we are <u>FREE</u> to <u>Walk in the Spirit</u> – because Jesus Christ has <u>paid the price</u> to <u>crucify</u> our flesh & <u>set us free</u> from it's <u>Bondage</u>

& so – <u>when we receive</u> **New Life** in Christ - the <u>Old Nature</u> is now <u>Crucified</u> - & we <u>can now</u> <u>live in the Spirit</u> . . .

**HOWEVER** – as always – <u>our only Role</u> is our "<u>Response</u>" to God's Grace & we have a <u>Role of Response</u> – to that <u>New Life in the Spirit</u> . . .

## **Gal 5:25**

25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

Remember – the word "walk" means to "Regulate One's Life" –

So <u>IF</u> we <u>Live</u> in the Spirit (thru our Faith in Christ) – <u>THEN</u> . . . Let us <u>ALSO Choose</u> to <u>Regulate our lives</u> <u>by</u> the Spirit

Jesus Christ has paid the price to <u>Crucify our Flesh</u>
The Holy Spirit indwells us – as our Power to <u>Live in the Spirit</u> . . .
Let's make the choice to <u>WALK in the Spirit</u> –
So we will **Not fulfill** the desires of the Flesh
