Mrk37 - The Rich Young Ruler - Mark 10:17-31

- We <u>Continue</u> In the "<u>The HARD Sayings of Jesus</u>" today <u>Our</u> 3rd "<u>Hard Sayings</u>" Message
- There was a Feeling (a belief) in Judaism in that day that Christianity has kind of 'held onto' today
- It is **the belief** that **WEALTH** was **the EVIDENCE**That **God** is **Blessing** you
- & Wealth certainly <u>CAN BE</u> a <u>Blessing from God</u> <u>DEPENDING</u> on the <u>Truths</u> we'll <u>learn today</u>
- But The Rabbis taught if you had Wealth

 It was a Sign that you were doing things right with God
- It meant that you had achieved a certain approval rating with God

Very similar

to the *Prosperity Teaching Heresy* of today

- But <u>today</u> we're going to <u>meet a man</u> who has <u>come</u> to <u>be known</u> - as "<u>The Rich Young Ruler</u>"
- & it is going to lead to one of the "Hard Sayings of Jesus" - About WEALTH

Let's Pray

It's important we connect our text today with our Previous Text

Because Mark PUTS his Events IN ORDER For a REASON

<u>Last week Jesus said – in Mark 10:15 (NLT)</u>

15 I tell you the truth, anyone who doesn't receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it."

<u>THEN</u> – on the <u>HEELS</u> of that <u>HUGE statement</u> –

(needing to receive the Kingdom of God Like a Child)

We MEET the <u>Rich Young Ruler</u>

Mark 10:17 (NLT)

17 As Jesus was starting out on his way to Jerusalem, a man came <u>running</u> up to him (that's our guy), <u>knelt down</u>, and asked, "<u>Good Teacher</u>, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

As our *Rich Young Ruler* – is introduced to us He is **RUNNING UP** to **Jesus** (a little intense)

Then **KNEELING down**

(I see him sliding in on his knees – for dramatic entrance)

& then he calls Jesus - GOOD TEACHER

<u>That is a three-fold - Over-Doing-It - introduction</u> <u>Running up</u>

Slides in on his knees

& Good Teacher

You see – **the Rabbis** would **never let anybody** call them **GOOD Teacher**

because they taught that only God was "Truly Good"

So – in V.18 -, Jesus kinda

"Splashes Water" in this guy's face To Shock him – to kinda "Slow his Roll"

Mark 10:18 (NLT)

18 "Why do you call me good?" Jesus asked. "Only God is truly good.

It seems to me – that <u>Jesus wants</u> to <u>INTERRUPT</u> this <u>guy's</u> "<u>Pattern for Success</u>"

This guy KNOWS how to WIN

He knows how to 'come on strong'
& 'take home the prize'

So Jesus *Interrupts him* – *Shocks him*

& <u>Suddenly</u> – <u>JESUS</u> is in <u>charge</u> of the <u>conversation</u> <u>NOT</u> the <u>Rich Young Ruler</u>

(you see what Jesus did there?)

So – **now** that **Jesus** has **CONTROL** of the **conversation**

he's **going** to **walk** this "**Over-Confident Young Ruler**" **RIGHT** to **where** he **wants him**

Not only for the <u>Rich Young Ruler's</u> Benefit – But <u>also</u> – <u>For OURS</u>

Jesus cont's - in Mark 10:19 (NLT)

19 But to answer your question, you know the commandments: 'You must not murder. You must not commit adultery. You must not steal. You must not testify falsely. You must not cheat anyone (coveting). Honor your father and mother."

Jesus begins by saying "to answer your question"

But – is Jesus <u>really answering</u> his <u>question</u>?

Or is <u>Jesus</u> just <u>GENTLY</u> setting up this <u>religious</u> '<u>over-achiever'</u>?

In <u>v.19</u> Jesus <u>lists ALL 6</u> of the <u>horizontal</u> (love your neighbor) <u>commands</u> – The <u>2nd half</u> of the <u>10 commandments</u>

But <u>notice</u> - Jesus <u>doesn't mention</u> the <u>1st half</u>

<u>Which</u> are the <u>4 vertical</u> (love God) <u>commandments</u>

& <u>MAYBE</u> it's <u>because</u> - - <u>Jesus</u> will <u>be GETTING to</u> the 'Love God' commands – soon enough

But – Because <u>Jesus</u> is <u>MOVING</u> this <u>guy</u> – to a <u>Crisis Moment</u> <u>Lists only</u> the <u>back-half</u> of the <u>law</u> (horizontal half)

& the *Rich Young Ruler*starts doing the HAPPY DANCE

& we read in - Mark 10:20 (NLT)

20 "Teacher," the man replied, "I've obeyed all these commandments since I was young."

& right here – this guy is thinking

"Man, I've <u>got</u> it – I've <u>nailed</u> it"

"I'm at the <u>top</u> of the <u>class</u> – I'm at the <u>front</u> of the <u>line</u>"

"I am <u>Good To GO</u> – With GOD"

& then – Jesus LOOKED AT HIM . . .

Not GLANCED at him – Not Casually
Jesus LOOKED INTENTLY at him

Mark 10:21(a) (NLT)

21 Looking at the man, Jesus felt genuine love for him . . .

The word translated 'Looking' means to look intently, or to examine closely

Jesus LOOKED into this man's HEART

Jesus LOOKED at what Truly Motivated Him

Jesus LOOKED at what this man, Actually LOVED

& Jesus felt genuine love for him

& Jesus was trying to LEAD HIM to the answer that he truly needed

Mark 10:21(b) (NLT)

21... "There is still one thing you haven't done," he told him. "Go and sell all your possessions and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

Listen to **me please**

What Jesus is saying
To THIS Rich Young Ruler

Is - Your STUFF is in your WAY

Jesus is saying

You **DON'T OWN** - your **Stuff** Your **Stuff** - **OWNS YOU**

<u>& THAT – is a PROBLEM</u>

Now – <u>Please</u> <u>ALWAYS Remember</u> <u>CONTEXT</u> determines <u>Correct Interpretation</u>

& <u>so</u> we've <u>GOT</u> to <u>keep</u> this <u>vs</u> in its CONTEXT So <u>first</u> – <u>Jesus</u> did <u>NOT tell</u> <u>EVERY wealthy person</u> he <u>met</u> to <u>do this</u>

<u>In fact</u> we <u>KNOW</u> – <u>there</u> were <u>wealthy people</u>

who **supported Jesus** & his **disciples during** their **3 years** of **full time ministry**

& to support them – Some chose to travel with them Since "Online Giving" wasn't a thing yet

AND we know – God moved on wealthy people - thru-out the NT

to <u>finance</u> & <u>provide places</u> for the **NT church** to **meet** & **Grow**

& <u>We see</u> in <u>Acts 4 & 5 – it was <u>NOT a requirement</u> for wealthy people to sell what they had</u>

BUT – **Some STILL DID** by **choice**

& | can tell you FOR SURE

that <u>BOTH</u> - this Church AND Word By Mail would NOT exist

without some people who have Some MONEY being willing to invest in God's Kingdom

THRU these Ministries

So - WHY this man?

Why did Jesus Require - THIS particular - successful, wealthy, religious man - to sell everything?

Because Jesus – LOOKED AT HIM & Jesus SAW his HEART

& <u>BECAUSE</u> <u>Jesus</u> <u>loved him</u> Jesus <u>REVEALED</u> this <u>man's OWN Heart</u> – to him

This <u>Rich Young Ruler</u>
had "<u>success in life</u>" written all <u>over him</u>

But – <u>the attitude</u> of <u>the heart</u> – <u>that can come</u> from <u>TOO MUCH Success</u> in life

can easily get in the way of us

Truly surrendering our lives to Jesus as Lord

Which is exactly – what is about to happen
To our *Rich Young Ruler* here

Mark 10:22 (NLT)

22 At this the man's face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

At this, the man's face FELL

The word means – to become greatly down-cast

But Listen very carefully please

His face fell, and he went away sad, because his Possessions - OWNED HIM

He <u>DIDN'T OWN</u> His <u>Possessions</u>
His <u>Possessions</u> <u>OWNED HIS HEART</u>

& Jesus REQUIRES - Your HEART

& it <u>seems clear</u> – BOTH in the Bible - & in our World

that one of the top things that will

either KEEP your heart - from Jesus or STEAL it AWAY - from Jesus

Are your Possessions OWNING YOU

Whether it is you IDOLIZING
What you DO HAVE

Or you COVETING
What you DON'T HAVE

Either way – the STUFF of this World
Can KEEP your Heart - FROM Jesus

<u>Remember Earlier</u> – Jesus <u>didn't list</u> the <u>FIRST HALF</u> – of the <u>10 Commandments</u>

those are the "Love God" commandments
& THAT WAS – the Rich Young Ruler's Struggle

The **FIRST Commandment** is "Have NO OTHER GODS before me"

The **SECOND Commandment** is "Have NO IDOLS in your life"

& the challenge Jesus gave this man - PROVED

he was **NOT WILLING** To **EMBRACE those** first two **Vertical Commands** to **Love God**

& so – he went away - SAD

& then – it just GETS HARDER for the Disciples

Mark 10:23 (NLT)

23 Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for the rich to enter the Kingdom of God!"

That is a **BOMBSHELL STATEMENT**

Because the disciples thought - (like some of us) that wealth - was the SIGN

That a person was APPROVED By God

& so - this Statement AMAZES the Disciples

Mark 10:24 (NLT)

24 <u>This amazed them</u>. But Jesus said again, "Dear children, it is very hard to enter the Kingdom of God.

The NKJV adds – it is very hard "for those who trust in riches" to enter the Kingdom of God

& it is <u>very hard indeed</u> – to <u>enter</u> the <u>kingdom of God</u> - <u>In fact – it is impossible</u>

Which is Exactly What Jesus says in

Mark 10:25 (NLT)

25 In fact, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of God!"

This vs has caused a LOT of attempted explanation

maybe you've heard the explanation of the SMALL DOOR within the LARGE Gate in Jerusalem

that is called the Eye of the Needle

We've had fun at this Eye of the Needle "Door"

That's part of the Jaffa Gate at the old city

The <u>only problem</u> is – there is <u>no Historical Evidence</u> of that <u>TYPE of Door</u> in the <u>Gate</u> – Until the <u>9th century</u>

BUT - The analogy that comesout of the small door within the gate explanation

is that the <u>rich person</u> has to <u>rid themselves</u> of <u>all</u> the <u>baggage</u> that <u>often comes</u> with <u>riches</u>

& <u>HUMBLE themselves</u> to <u>receive Christ by Faith</u> & <u>enter heaven</u>

Which **CAN BE** a **good analogy** – **if** it's **used correctly**

BUT – that is **Probably NOT** what **Jesus** was **talking about**

Because the Camel & the Eye of the Needle

Was actually a "Figure of Speech" in the first century

It is - HYPERBOLE

& when you say – it would be easier for a Camel to go thru the Eye of a Needle

What you're saying is
THIS is IMPOSSIBLE - Period!

Which is exactly what Jesus ends up saying

But first - The disciples were astounded

Look at Mark 10:26 (NLT) \rightarrow

Mark 10:26 (NLT)

26 The disciples were astounded. "Then who in the world can be saved?" they asked.

The **Disciple's heads** are **SPINNING** right **now**

<u>They're thinking</u> – "Wait - <u>We</u> thought <u>riches</u> were a <u>sign</u> of <u>God's Approval</u> on someone's life"

So – <u>if someone</u> with <u>Riches</u> <u>CAN'T Be Saved</u> then <u>WHO in the world</u> - <u>can be?</u>

& THAT is really the ultimate POINT

Which is what Jesus says in Mark 10:27 (NLT)

27 Jesus looked at them intently (the same word for looked as before – Jesus looked straight thru them) and said, "<u>Humanly speaking, it is impossible</u>. But not with God. Everything is possible with God."

WHO can get into Heaven?

Jesus says - Humanly Speaking - It is Impossible!!

Without GOD

Stepping in - & Doing it FOR US

It is IMPOSSIBLE - for us to Get into Heaven

& <u>if WE - - IF ALL of us - Rich & Poor</u>
Would fully <u>embrace THAT truth</u>

We **would stop trying** to be "Good Enough" or "Religious Enough"

& we would crush the Devil's Lie that makes us say

"Well, I'm doing pretty good, I think God will accept me when I get there"

Not if you're showing up in your own effort he WON'T

The **Bible** is **CLEAR**

There is **no amount** of **GOOD that you can do** on **your own**

to **EARN God's Acceptance** of you - **into Heaven**

& <u>Ultimately</u> – <u>this is true</u> – <u>For RICH or POOR</u>

But the CORE of THIS Message
The CENTRAL Point of this Message

Is how the Possessions
that OWNED - this Rich Young Ruler

KEPT HIM from **seeing** his **need for Jesus**

Matthew 6:24 (NLT)

24 "No one can serve two masters. For you will hate one and love the other; you will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and be enslaved to money.

The word translated "Money" here - is MAMMON an Aramaic word - for WEALTH or RICHES

This Rich Young Ruler - was Enslaved by his Riches & it seemingly cost him - his eternal life

But – it also brought up a thought – from the "Ever-Willing-To-Speak" – Apostle Peter

Mark 10:28 (NLT)

28 Then Peter began to speak up. "We've given up everything to follow you," he said.

Now – Peter <u>IS a Fisherman</u> & it <u>certainly seems</u> like <u>he's FISHING</u> here

& <u>Jesus responds</u> to <u>him</u> with <u>one</u> of the <u>Greatest Promises</u> in <u>the N.T</u>.

Mark 10:29-30 (NLT)

29 "Yes," Jesus replied, "and I assure you that everyone who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or property, for my sake and for the Good News, 30 will receive now in return a hundred times as many houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children, and property—

<u>along with persecution</u>. And in the world to come that person will have eternal life.

<u>Jesus promises</u> – a <u>HUNDRED TIMES</u> more <u>BLESSING</u> <u>Than what</u> it <u>will COST</u> you - to <u>truly Follow Him</u>

ALONG WITH the **Persecution**

You will gain a HUNDRED TIMES the FAMILY
Within the Family of God

& the very real Blessings
Will always Far Outweigh – the COST

& then - in closing - it seems

Jesus Refers back

to the Rich Young Ruler - who just walked away

& he says in Mark 10:31 (NLT)

31 But many who are the greatest now will be least important then, and those who seem least important now will be the greatest then."

The **Kingdom of God** is an **UPSIDE DOWN Kingdom**

WE – LIKE the <u>Rich Young Ruler</u> - <u>MUST Decide</u>

Which Kingdom – We want our REWARD IN

Do we want to WIN IT ALL - NOW & Risk LOSING IT ALL - for ETERNITY?

Just 2 Ch's ago – Jesus said - Mark 8:36–37 (NLT)

36 And what do you benefit if you gain the whole world but lose your own soul? 37 Is anything worth more than your soul?

Jesus tried to get the Rich Young Ruler
To CHOOSE WISELY

<u>May we - Make</u> a <u>Better Choice</u> <u>Than HE DID</u>

Whether we are RICH or POOR

May we MAKE SURE

That Jesus Christ - TRULY HAS our Heart
