### Spc184 - Standing Up in a Fallen World - Dan & Acts

Let's Pray & get right to it

This **morning** – I just want to **walk** through <u>**3** great events</u> in the Bible - (2 OT & 1 NT)

We'll start - in Dan Ch 3 - (after Isa, Jer, Lam, Eze)

## Daniel 3:1 (NLT)

1 King Nebuchadnezzar made a gold statue ninety feet tall and nine feet wide and set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon.

<u>Nebuchadnezzar</u> was the <u>King</u> of Babylon & this was a <u>Statue</u> of <u>Himself</u>

& then – <u>all</u> the people in <u>Babylon</u> (incld'g the <u>Jews</u> who had been <u>taken</u> there in captivity)

#### were told in Daniel 3:5-6 (NLT)

5 When you hear the sound of the horn, flute, zither, lyre, harp, pipes, and other musical instruments, <u>bow to the</u> <u>ground</u> to worship King Nebuchadnezzar's gold statue. 6 Anyone who refuses to obey will immediately be thrown into a blazing furnace."

Then – in <u>Vs's 8-12</u> some of the '<u>political</u> leaders' of <u>Babylon</u> <u>went</u> to the King – & <u>told</u> him

Shadrach, Meshach & Abednego - Refused to follow the order of the State – that dictated their right to Worship & so – in <u>v.13</u> - the <u>Governor</u> – (*I mean the King*) flew into a rage - & had these 3 brought to him

### <u>& then the Governor says to them- in V.14</u> (my paraphrase): "is it true that you have refused to worship in the way I have dictated that you must?"

Then the <u>governor</u> gives them <u>one</u> more <u>chance</u> to <u>BOW</u> to his <u>dictates</u> regarding their <u>worship</u>

& then we see the response from these God-Followers

& this would be - the correct response

if a governor were to remove our rights and dictate how WE should worship

# Daniel 3:16-18 (NLT)

16 Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego replied, "O [Governor] Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you.

17 If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God whom we serve is <u>able</u> to save us. He <u>will</u> rescue us from your power, Your Majesty.

18 But <u>even if he doesn't</u>, we want to make it clear to you, Your Majesty, that we will never serve your gods or worship the gold statue you have set up."

We <u>Kneel To</u>, we <u>Bow To</u>, & <u>We Worship</u> <u>ONE GOD ONLY</u> & it is not a *Political* or an Anarchist Organization

We <u>Kneel To</u>, <u>Bow To</u>, and <u>Worship</u> The <u>Lord</u> of <u>Heaven & Earth</u>, <u>Jesus Christ</u> – <u>ALONE</u>

& if you don't know the Story

These 3 Hebrews - Were thrown into the Fire

& <u>Jesus MET THEM</u> In the <u>Fire</u> & <u>Jesus</u> carried them <u>safely</u> <u>THREW the Fire</u>

<u>Which seems</u> to be pretty <u>clear support</u> from <u>God</u> <u>For</u> these 3 <u>God-Fearing Men</u>

Who <u>Humbly Refused</u> to <u>Obey</u> the <u>Governments Dictates</u> - <u>regarding</u> their <u>Worship</u>

I'm **praying** you see a '**subtle'** connection In these **<u>3 events</u>** today – *Are you starting to see it?* 

Next - turn over to Dan Ch 6

<u>Some years</u> later – There's a <u>New King</u> in charge & <u>Daniel</u> holds a <u>Government Position</u>

& the King respected Daniel

But <u>others</u> in the gov't were <u>out</u> to <u>get Daniel</u> – <u>at ANY Cost</u> (<u>sound</u> like <u>any government</u> you know) So – the <u>competing political party</u> – <u>Tricks</u> the <u>King</u> into <u>issuing</u> a royal <u>decree</u> - that can't be <u>changed</u>

& <u>GUESS</u> what the <u>Royal Decree</u> was about . . . *HOW people were allowed to Worship* 

Here are the CONNIVERS – CONVINCING the King

Daniel 6:7(b) (NLT)

7 We are all in agreement . . . that the king should make a law that will be strictly enforced. Give orders that for the next thirty days any person who prays to anyone, divine or human—except to you, Your Majesty—will be thrown into the den of lions.

<u>Notice</u> – this <u>LAW</u> – <u>Dictated</u> <u>HOW</u> people were <u>Allowed</u> to <u>Worship</u> - for the <u>next 30 days</u>

It's <u>almost</u> like <u>there</u> was a <u>Pandemic</u> or <u>something</u> that <u>made</u> the <u>King</u> feel - <u>he</u> could <u>make</u> such a <u>law</u>

& so – what did Daniel DO

When he <u>heard</u> about <u>this law</u> – <u>that Dictated</u> - <u>HOW</u> he was <u>allowed</u> to <u>worship</u>

Daniel 6:10 (NLT)

10 But when Daniel learned that the law had been signed, he went home and knelt down <u>as usual</u> in his upstairs room,

with its windows open toward Jerusalem. He prayed three times a day, <u>just as he had always done</u>, giving thanks to his God.

- & <u>so</u> Daniel's <u>political opponents</u> (<u>of course</u>) were <u>watching</u>
- & they **ran merrily** to the **King with** this **news**
- & <u>Altho</u> the <u>King didn't</u> want to <u>he</u> had <u>no choice</u> but to <u>throw Daniel</u> into the <u>Lion's den</u>

The King had been duped by these political snakes -

<u>Aren't</u> you <u>glad</u> things like <u>that</u> <u>never happen</u> in <u>OUR political system</u>

The King was actually pulling for Daniel

<u>so</u> after a <u>night</u> in the <u>Lion's Den</u> the <u>King ran</u> to the <u>Den</u>

<u>& we read in - Daniel 6:20 (NLT)</u> 20 When he got there, he called out in anguish, "Daniel, servant of the living God! Was your God, whom you serve so faithfully, able to rescue you from the lions?"

Then **Daniel responds** - & I want you to look very closely at the last words Daniel says

## Daniel 6:21–22 (NLT)

21 Daniel answered, "Long live the king! 22 My God sent his angel to shut the lions' mouths so that they would not hurt me, for <u>I have been found innocent in his</u> <u>sight</u>. And <u>I have not wronged you</u>, Your Majesty."

#### Wait a minute

Daniel had Disobeyed a <u>written law</u> of the <u>Government</u> of the <u>Land</u>

& <u>yet</u> we <u>read</u> here, Daniel was found innocent <u>in God's sight</u>

& <u>not only</u> that – but <u>Daniel</u> was <u>able</u> to <u>say</u> to the <u>King</u> And <u>I have not wronged you</u>, Your Majesty

How do we balance this

that <u>Daniel broke</u> the <u>law</u> – but was <u>not found WRONG</u> <u>in</u> either <u>God's sight</u> - or the <u>King's sight</u>

<u>Here's what Warren Wiersbe says about this vs</u> This means that the king's law about prayer was rejected in heaven and that Daniel was right in disobeying it. By suggesting such a law, the scheming officers disobeyed the true and living God and robbed Him of the glory He deserved.

Now – <u>listen</u> to me <u>please</u>

Daniel did not organize a *political anarchist movement* & start destroying people's lives and property He **<u>didn't deman</u>d to <u>defund</u> or <u>threaten</u> to <u>kill</u> the <u>police</u>** 

- & he <u>didn't promise</u> to <u>burn</u> the <u>system down</u> <u>if</u> he <u>didn't get</u> what he <u>wanted</u>
- Daniel <u>CHOSE</u> to <u>quietly embrace</u> his <u>freedom to worship</u> <u>that</u> was <u>given</u> to him <u>by GOD</u>
- & **because** of **the way** he **went about** it he was **found innocent** in the **eyes** of **God** - **AND** the **King**
- But <u>let's not miss</u> one <u>critical truth</u> We <u>see</u> in <u>both</u> of these <u>events</u> in Daniel
- In both events these God-followers were WILLING
- to **<u>quietly</u>** and <u>**humbly DIE**</u> **<u>for</u>** their <u>**right**</u> to <u>**Worship God**</u>
- They <u>didn't confront</u> the <u>government</u> they <u>didn't attack</u> the <u>system</u> –
- But, with Quiet Resolve & prepared to die

they <u>refused</u> to <u>allow</u> the <u>STATE</u> to <u>tell them</u> how <u>To Worship</u>

& - in <u>BOTH cases</u> <u>God</u> was <u>WITH THEM</u> – <u>IN</u> the <u>Midst</u> of <u>it</u>

### So – <u>How bout</u> some <u>N.T truth?</u> Let's <u>head over</u> to - <u>Acts Ch 4</u>

As Acts Ch 4 Opens

Peter & John had just healed a man – AT the Temple & now – they were teaching the people

# <u>& we pick up – in Acts 4:1–3 (NLT)</u>

1 While Peter and John were speaking to the people, they were confronted by the priests, the captain of the Temple guard, and some of the Sadducees.

2 These leaders were very disturbed that Peter and John were teaching the people that through Jesus there is a resurrection of the dead.

3 They arrested them and, since it was already evening, put them in jail until morning.

- In the <u>following Vs's</u> the <u>Sanhedrin Counsel</u> <u>brought</u> them <u>in</u> - to <u>question</u> them
- & The <u>Jewish Sanhedrin Counsel</u> HAD <u>Civil</u> & <u>Criminal</u> <u>Jurisdiction</u> – as well as <u>Religious</u> – at that time

& in <u>V.7</u> - the <u>Counsel Demanded</u> By what power, or in whose name, had the Apostles healed a man the previous day

& in <u>V.10</u> – Filled with the Holy Spirit – Peter Responded

## Acts 4:10 (NLT)

10 Let me clearly state to all of you and to all the people of Israel that he was healed by the powerful name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the man you crucified but whom God raised from the dead.

& <u>Then</u> – <u>quite</u> a <u>dust-up</u> occurs within the <u>Sanhedrin Counsel</u>

## & finally - Acts 4:18 says (NLT)

18 So they called the apostles back in and commanded them never again to speak or teach in the name of Jesus.

& then we read the response in

## <u>Acts 4:19-20 – Our Key Vs's (NLT)</u>

19 But Peter and John replied, "<u>Do you think God wants us</u> to obey you rather than him?

20 We cannot stop telling about everything we have seen and heard."

Then in <u>V.21</u> – the <u>counsel threatens</u> them <u>further</u>, but <u>lets them go</u>

& <u>then</u> the <u>believers PRAY</u> for <u>Courage</u> – <u>because</u> they <u>KNOW</u> - their <u>lives</u> are <u>on the line</u>

#### & then we read in Acts 4:31 (NLT)

31 After this prayer, the meeting place shook, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. Then they preached the word of God with boldness. Which <u>means</u> they <u>DEFIED</u> the <u>Civil & Criminal Jurisdiction</u> of the <u>time</u>

Because the government (as it were) tried to stop them from Preaching & teaching in the Name of Jesus

& <u>the more</u> they <u>Preached</u> and <u>Taught</u> the <u>more people</u> came to <u>Believe in Jesus</u>

<u>& then – we read in Acts 5:17–18 (NLT)</u> 17 The high priest and his officials, who were Sadducees, were filled with jealousy. 18 They arrested the apostles and put them in the public jail.

They were put in Jail

for **Defying** a **Government Mandate** about **Preaching** in the **Name of Jesus** 

The Question is - DID GOD - Support them

in their <u>decision</u> – to <u>Continue</u> to <u>Preach Jesus</u> when the <u>Government</u> told them <u>Not to</u>

Well, <u>let's see</u> – (so the <u>Apostles</u> are <u>in jail</u> for <u>proclaiming</u> the Gospel)

<u>& then we read – in Acts 5:19–20 (NLT)</u> 19 But an angel of the Lord came at night, opened the gates of the jail, and brought them out. Then he told them, 20 "Go to the Temple and give the people this message of life!"

Well - That <u>SEEMS</u> <u>Pretty Supportive</u> on <u>God's Part</u>, <u>doesn't</u> it

#### So - the Apostles DO

what the Angel of the Lord tells them to do

& <u>So</u> the <u>Sanhedrin arrests</u> them <u>again</u>

### & says to them - In Acts 5:28 (NLT)

28 "We gave you strict orders never again to teach in this man's name!" he said. "Instead, you have filled all Jerusalem with your teaching about him . . .

## & then - Acts 5:29 (NLT)

29 But Peter and the apostles replied (to the governing authority), "<u>We must obey God rather than any human</u> <u>authority</u>.

Again, <u>no protests</u> – <u>no riots</u> – <u>no abusing police</u> officers or <u>burning businesses</u>

<u>Just</u> a <u>Humble</u>, <u>Gentle</u> response "We must obey God rather than any human authority."

#### & the <u>Apostles KNEW</u> what the <u>consequences</u> of <u>that statement</u> would be

- & so in <u>Acts 5:33</u> the <u>High Counsel</u> decides to <u>KILL</u> the <u>Apostles</u>
- & <u>God</u> uses <u>One Pharisee</u> to talk them <u>out of it</u> (<u>Paul's</u> teacher – <u>Gamaliel</u>)

# & in Acts 5:40-42 we read (NLT)

40 The others accepted his advice. (& instead) They called in the apostles and had them flogged (no small consequence). Then they ordered them never again to speak in the name of Jesus, and they let them go.

41 The apostles left the high council <u>rejoicing</u> that God had counted them worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus.

42 And every day, in the Temple and from house to house, they <u>continued to teach and preach this message</u>: "Jesus is the Messiah."

Humbly – Respectfully – & Willing to Die

The <u>Apostles continued</u> to <u>Teach & Preach</u> <u>this</u> message: *"Jesus is the Messiah."* 

I WANT to BE COUNTED – WITH THEM!!

So – <u>THREE Great Events</u> in the <u>Bible</u> <u>ALL</u> with <u>the Same (not so subtle)</u> <u>Point</u>

### BUT - maybe you're familiar with Rom Ch 13

or <u>maybe</u> you've <u>heard</u> that <u>Scripture</u> Ref <u>thrown around</u> during these <u>times</u>

Let's head over there (Rom 13) - & let's read the first 2 Vs's just to get the context of the Ch

### Romans 13:1–2 (NLT)

 Everyone must submit to governing authorities. For all authority comes from God, and those in positions of authority have been placed there by God.
 So anyone who rebels against authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and they will be punished.

How can we **RECONCILE** These <u>Vs's</u> (Rom 13) with <u>everything</u> we've <u>looked at</u> so far?

Please, Listen to me very carefully

Everything we've read – prior to Romans 13 has had the SAME SUBJECT

Which is - The Government Mandating - or Dictating

How we CAN or CANNOT - Worship God or <u>PREACH</u> - in the <u>Name of Jesus</u>

Guys - <u>In ALL Matters</u> – <u>We</u> are <u>called</u> to (& we <u>must</u>) <u>Respect</u> the <u>Law</u> & the <u>Governing Authorities</u> If we DO NOT – then Anarchy will be Result – which is exactly what we are seeing in our country today

HOWEVER – there is a time – when we are called to <u>Respectfully & Humbly</u>

LAY CLAIM to our "*Right to Worship*" & to our "*Right to Proclaim*" the <u>Name of Jesus</u>

<u>Let</u> me <u>read</u> a <u>quote</u> by a <u>famous</u> <u>Bible Scholar</u> - from <u>1989</u>

### William MacDonald, Believer's Bible Commentary

In every ordered society there must be authority and submission to that authority. Otherwise you have a state of anarchy . . . There is an exception, of course. A Christian is not required to obey if the government orders him <u>to sin</u> or <u>to</u> <u>compromise his loyalty to Jesus Christ</u>. No government has a right to command a person's conscience. So there are times when a believer must, by obeying God, incur the wrath of man. In such cases he must be prepared to pay the penalty without undue complaint.

Which is exactly what we've seen in our <u>3 separate events</u> this morning

We <u>Want</u> to be <u>counted</u> among <u>those</u> Who <u>Respectfully</u> & <u>Humbly</u>

LAY CLAIM to our "Right to Worship"
& our "Right to Proclaim" the Name of Jesus

#### & <u>we want</u> to <u>humbly</u> <u>be prepared</u> to Pay the Penalty without undue complaint

### We want to <u>STAND UP for JESUS</u> In a <u>World</u> that is <u>FALLING DOWN</u>
