

BIBLE EXPLORATION

Read Genesis 37:26–28, 39:13–20, 40:6–41:1, 41:37–43, 45:4–8.

In the above passages, we read the different experiences that dotted Joseph’s life. Much of it is unpleasant. How do you think, young Joseph, understands the will of God—especially when he was sold as a slave, falsely accused, and forgotten in jail?

How does Joseph explain the will of God when he reveals himself to his brothers in Genesis 45? What is something that we can learn from the posture of Joseph?

Read Psalm 119: 9,11, 105, 130.

According to the Psalmist, how do we know the right path to walk on?

Just as Ranjit mentioned, how does the discipline of studying scripture help in knowing God’s will in our day-to-day life? What are some practical ways we inculcate this discipline in our lives?

LAST WORD

Generally, the topic of knowing God’s will in ‘my’ life can be a very stressful experience. But through today’s session, we understand that we have a loving Father who has a sovereign will (something that needn’t burden us) and a revealed will through His Scriptures which helps us in every step we take. He orchestrates moments and experiences in our life that will make us depend on and trust in Him more! A great relief for us is that we need not control the multiple variables in our life, instead, we can choose to obey Him as He reveals Himself more and more to me. There is great joy in knowing that He holds our tomorrow.
