

6. Explain what happened to the men of city after they were circumcised.
7. What was Jacob's worry now that the men of the city were slaughtered by Simeon and Levi?
8. Before going to back to Bethel as God commanded, Jacob told his family to prepare themselves to worship there by doing what three things?
