PASTOR LYLE - ROMANS 12:4-8 SUMMARY – 3/22/26

## **KEY SCRIPTURE**

### **Romans 12:1–8 (NAS)**

1 Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship. 2 And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect. 3 For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think more highly of himself than he ought to think; but to think so as to have sound judgment, as God has allotted to each a measure of faith. 4 For just as we have many members in one body and all the members do not have the same function, 5 so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. 6 Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to exercise them accordingly: if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith; 7 if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching; 8 or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

## **START TALKING**

Pastor Lyle began by talking about a white-knuckle experience of driving in the snow. What was your worst driving experience?

## **START DISCUSSING**

### **WHITE KNUCKLES OR OPEN HANDS**

#### **Read Romans 12:1-8**

Pastor Lyle used two pictures: gripping the steering wheel in a storm and open hands in the sunshine. He connected that contrast to surrender in Romans 12.

**Discuss the difference between living with clenched fists and living with open hands before God.**

**What are the signs that you are gripping something too tightly right now? Why is surrender often harder in practice than it is in theory?**

### **GOD'S DESIGN FOR THE BODY**

The sermon stressed that dependence is not isolation but mutual reliance. We belong to one another in Christ.

**Why do people resist God's design for life together?**

**What makes dependence on other believers difficult?**

**How have you seen freedom inside God's design for the body instead of outside it?**

### **OPEN TO SERVICE**

Pastor Lyle said every believer is gifted and called to serve, and that there are no spectators in the body of Christ.

**Why do you think some believers stay on the sidelines?**

**How does serving others expose both our strengths and our weaknesses?**

**What happens to a church body when people discover their gifts but do not deploy them?**

### **THE BODY NEEDS YOU**

One of the strongest lines in the sermon was the reminder that if you do not do your part, others suffer, and if others do not do their part, you suffer.

**How does that statement challenge individualistic Christianity?**

**In what ways have you been helped by the gifts of others in the church?**

**How might others be missing something if you hold back your own gift?**

### **ACTION STEPS THIS WEEK**

**Take a moment to identify one place where your hands are still clenched.**

**Then identify one way you can open your hands this week.**

**Ask yourself: What needs do I naturally see and desire to meet?**
