KEY SCRIPTURE

Romans 10:13-15

13 for "Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved."

14 How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher?

15 How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news of good things!"

THINKING BACKWARDS THROUGH THE PROCESS

Read Romans 10:13-15

Paul begins with the moment of salvation and then works backwards. Take some time to talk through each of the steps in the process.

- Call on the name of the Lord
- Believed
- Heard
- Preacher
- Sent

Can some of you share the background of your salvation? Things like:

"Who shared the gospel with you?"

"What were the circumstances that led to the encounter?"

"What was behind the person's motivation who shared the gospel?"

NORA'S STORY

Pastor Lyle shared the story of Nora Murchison, a missionary to Malawi for 40 years. She arrived in 1953, eventually being joined by her husband, Daryl Ring. Pastor Lyle claimed "leading someone to Christ" is better than winning the Super Bowl, a game watched by over 125 million viewers.
