This message, the 30^{th} in a series called *The Book of John*, was given at The Bridge Community Church by Chris Hanchey on March 31, 2013.

A Chronology of the 40 Days from Jesus' resurrection to His ascension...

THAT FIRST "EASTER MORNING"

- 1. An earthquake-producing angel rolls away the stone from Jesus' tomb before sunrise (Matt 28:2–4).
- 2. The terrified soldiers assigned to guard Jesus' tomb leave their post to report these events. They are bribed (Matt 28:11–15) and conspire with Israel's chief priests to circulate a story that the disciples came in the night and stole the body of Jesus while they slept.
- 3. Some women followers of Jesus arrive to anoint Jesus' body only to discover the stone has been rolled away (Matt 28:1; Mark 16:1–4; Luke 24:1–3; John 20:1).
- **4.** The women see two "men"—actually angels (Matt 28:2-3; Mark 16:5; Luke 24:4). One of the women, Mary Magdalene, leaves immediately to inform Peter and John that "they" have taken Jesus' body away (John 20:1–2).
- 5. The other women remain, enter the tomb, and one of the angels tells them about the Resurrection, and instructs them to report this news to the disciples (Matt 28:5–7; Mark 16:5–7; Luke 24:4–8). The women leave quickly to do so (Matt 28:8; Luke 24:9).
- **6.** Upon hearing the report of the empty tomb, Peter and John run to investigate (Luke 24:12; John 20:3–10). Seeing the vacant tomb, and the grave clothes of Jesus, they return to their homes.
- 7. Mary Magdalene returns to the garden tomb and Jesus appears to her alone (Mark 16:9–11; John 20:11–18): *This is His first appearance*.
- **8.** Jesus appears to the other women—Mary, mother of James, Salome, and Joanna (Matt 28:8–10): *This is the second appearance of the risen Christ*.
- 9. Jesus appears to Peter (Luke 24:34; 1 Cor. 15:5): This is Jesus' third appearance.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON

10. Jesus appears to Cleopas and another downcast disciple on the road to Emmaus (Mark 16:12–13; Luke 24:13–32): *This is the fourth appearance of the resurrected Jesus*.

SUNDAY EVENING

- 11. The two men from the Emmaus Road encounter return to Jerusalem to tell the 11 disciples (plus others), that like Peter, they have seen the Lord (Luke 24:33–35). Apparently Thomas leaves.
- **12.** Jesus then appears to the remaining disciples in the Upper Room (Luke 24:36–43; John 20:19–25): *This is the Lord's fifth appearance*.

A WEEK LATER

13. Jesus appears to all 11 apostles, including Thomas. "Doubting" Thomas believes and worships Jesus as God (John 20:26–28): *This is Christ's sixth appearance*.

THE REMAINING 32 DAYS

- 14. Jesus appears to seven disciples at the Sea of Galilee and facilitates a miraculous catch of fish, even eating fish Himself; he also restores Peter (John 21:1–14): *This is His seventh appearance*.
- **15.** Jesus appears to more than 500 believers (including the eleven disciples) at a mountain in Galilee (Matt 28:16–20; Mark 16:15–18; 1 Cor. 15:6): *This is His eighth appearance*.
- **16.** Jesus appears to His skeptical half-brother James (1 Cor. 15:7): *This is His ninth appearance*.
- **17.** At Jerusalem Jesus appears again to His disciples (Luke 24:44–49; Acts 1:3–8): *This is the tenth appearance* of Jesus.
- **18.** There at the Mount of Olives Jesus ascends into heaven while the disciples watch (Mark 16:19–20; Luke 24:50–53; Acts 1:9–12).
