QUESTIONS FOR FURTHER REFLECTION:

1. Scott spoke of a time in his life when someone invested deeply in him and it had profound impact on his life. Do you have a person or time that you can say deeply impacted you? Explain the time.
2. Reread Philippians 2:19-30. Go through and underline those words or phrases that involve or evoke emotion. Does this seem like a casual relationship? What does it take to move toward this type of community? Do you have people in your life like those described in this text?
3. We can see from this text that Paul's investment in these two men was intentional. Who is currently investing in you? Who are you investing in at this moment? As a group take some time to affirm the gifts and abilities of those you are sitting around. Challenge those in your group to pray over a person to invest in deeply.
4. Because Paul had such deep relationships with these two men he could easily have desired them to stay with him. Instead, Paul sent these men away. Paul understood that the Kingdom was bigger than his relational desires. Do you have anyone around you right now that would be better served leading a group instead of being a member of yours? What does it look like to launch others? (Our kids, friends, small group members)
